

Nation-wide funding cuts to local roading improvements could have a significant impact on Selwyn motorists' safety.

Last week the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) informed the Council that its funding for local roading projects, contained in the current National Land Transport Programme (NLTP), would be cut due to a nation-wide funding shortfall.

This means key roading projects to improve safety and enhance the network to fit in with the Christchurch Southern Motorway extension are unlikely to go ahead as planned, says Deputy Mayor Malcolm Lyall. This includes some cycleway projects.

"While we have had a constructive working relationship with the NZTA in the region, vital projects which we were planning to improve the safety and efficiency of roading network, particularly our roads feeding into the Christchurch Southern Motorway, have been halted unexpectedly due to a shortfall in national transport funding.

"This puts our residents and other motorists at risk on main roads that are in desperate need of safety upgrades."

The NZTA had indicated a likely subsidy assistance of \$5.6m. This was incorporated into the Council's financial forecasts and work plan.

Local roading projects in the 2018-21 NLTP which will now not proceed include:

- · Blakes/Shands and Springs/Marshs Road intersection safety upgrades at Prebbleton (\$9.6m)
- · Weedons Ross Road widening and upgrade at Rolleston (\$1m)
- · Rolleston to Templeton cycleway (\$400k).

The NZTA attributes the shortfall to some large transport projects which need to be completed costing significantly more than estimated, along with the cost of other current projects, the number of carry-forward projects from previous programmes and an emphasis on 'green' transport initiatives.

Mr Lyall says the Council will continue to negotiate with the NZTA to find other ways to help pay for the district's much needed roading and transport improvements.

"We're hopeful of creating a solution to this issue. Our local arterial roads between Selwyn and Christchurch are carrying more traffic than most of the state highways in the district, at over 10,000 vehicles per day," he says.

Road maintenance programmes are not affected by the signalled funding cuts.

Drive safe this winter

Winter has arrived, bringing more challenging driving conditions, including rain, fog, ice, snow, shorter daylight hours and less visibility.

"As the snow and rain at the start of June reminded us, conditions on the roads in Selwyn can get quite tricky in winter and require more care. People need to plan a bit of extra time to fully defrost the car before starting journeys and travel more slowly on wet or icy roads," says Council Safety Coordinator Peter Daly.

The Council has a stock of windscreen scrapers – you can pick one up for free at the Council service centre in Rolleston.

Motorists should reduce speed when travelling in the frosty conditions in the morning and evening. Ice can also be a problem during the day on patches of road shaded by trees or fences, so watch out for this and reduce your speed before entering these areas.

It's also important to stay visible in gloomy conditions or fog by putting your lights on, Mr Daly says.

Southbridge School Principal Tamara Bell say the campaign was a big hit with her pupils.

Our kids loved participating and were over the moon to get their hands on some of the awesome prizes!"





Council backs banning the bag

With the national ban on businesses distributing single use plastic bags coming into effect next month, the council is continuing to encourage people in Selwyn to move away from plastic bags.

From Monday 1 July plastic shopping bags will need to go in the red bin—which goes to landfill, rather than in the recycling bin.

The decision to stop taking shopping bags in the recycling was a result of the dramatic fall in the number of bags, following the decision by major supermarkets and the government to phase them out.

"It's great that we've been seeing a drop in the number of plastic bags that have been going into bins across Selwyn since the start of the year. We're asking people to continue that good work and keep using alternatives such as durable reusable bags and boxes."

Along with using boxes or durable reusable bags, ways to reduce plastic could include wrapping your organic waste in newspaper or soiled cardboard such as pizza boxes, Mr Boyd says. Some supermarkets also deliver online shopping in brown paper bags.

The nation-wide ban on businesses distributing single-use plastic bags will also come into effect on the same day. Some plastic bags such as rubbish bags, small bags without handles and bags for pet waste or nappies will still be available in stores, although the Council is encouraging people to think about alternatives for these too.
