

Continuing our series profiling winners at the 2018 Selwyn Awards. Mana, 10, and Tui, 8, Martin won the Innovation Excellence Award for their business Plastic Straws Suck.

Amongst the youngest nominees for the Selwyn Awards, Tui and Mana were fitting winners of an award that recognises the outstanding innovative contribution of individuals, social enterprises or businesses in Selwyn.

A school project about the impact of plastic in oceans inspired the passionate beach users.

"The beach is a fun place to be with all your mates and friends and family. If there's lots of plastic it pollutes the ocean and that's not very cool!" says Tui.

With the assistance of dad Nathan, Plastic Straws Suck was born.

With the aim of having hometown Lincoln plastic straw-free by 2020 and donating 25% of their profits to organisations dedicated to removing plastic from oceans, Mana and Tui have spent tireless hours talking to hospitality businesses about the impact of plastic straws and selling metal straws at local markets and through their Facebook page.

Being entered into the Awards was a surprise, as their mum's friend nominated them and only told them a couple of weeks before the Gala Dinner.

Reflecting on the evening, Manu recounts "My fav [favourite] part was getting to know everyone, putting our idea out there and talking about what other people have done to get there and how amazing their journey had been. When we heard our name called as the winner, we were surprised. It felt really amazing".

"It was really cool watching the entertainment and the food was really yummy. We also got to meet the Mayor and wear his Mayoral chains, which was cool... and he also bought some metal straws off us!" Tui remembers enthusiastically.

"Winning the award has definitely changed the way locals look at us," Mana says. "And more companies are going plastic straw-free off the back of winning."

# 10,000 reasons to be road safety aware

We're reminding drivers to stay alert and drive safely as children return to school next week.

From next Monday 27 January, over 10,000 Selwyn children will be heading back to school – that's nearly 20% of our population on the move.

Selwyn School Road Safety Coordinator Stephanie Hautler is encouraging everyone to keep their eyes peeled for our young people heading back to school by foot and on wheels.

For those heading to school here are some travel safety tips:

- $\cdot$  Be bright and be seen. Ask your school for a safety vest.
- $\cdot$  Tackle the routes together, talking about sneaky driveways and blind corners.
- $\cdot$  Get out and active together to reduce the chaos at the school gate.
- $\cdot$  Wear your helmets, this goes for caregivers too... young people are watching you!

People can also take advantage of the more settled weather to get out of the car and get active with their children and familiarise themselves with hazards on the route.

"Road safety awareness is an important life skill and starts developing when you are young. Take every opportunity to educate children on how to safely cross a road using their eyes and ears" says Mrs Hautler.

"A fluoro yellow hi-viz makes your child visible in poor weather as well as bright sun. Most schools have them available for free or a small cost and they really make a difference."

If you are pushed for time, park a block back from school so that your child can scoot or walk. It is good for them both physically and mentally, develops their road safety skills and helps with overall congestion at the school gate, she says.

# Property files now available in electronic format

Customers wanting to view a property file, or other Council records, can now book this service online, and view most files electronically once the booking has been confirmed. There is a period of time required to scan the physical files, this depends on the size of the consent.

The Council maintains a huge archive of records such as property files, resource consents, cemetery records, liquor licences and other documents.

Most Councils, including Selwyn, are now converting paper records to digital files. For customers this means property files and other records can now be made available electronically, rather than in paper form

This will also make it much easier to sort and retrieve files, and means we'll be able to send copies of records directly to customers.

Some archive files will still be in paper format while we work through the digitisation process.

To request an electronic copy of a property file or record, or to book a viewing at the Council's Rolleston offices, visit selwyn.govt.nz/propertyfiles or call the customer team on 0800 SELWYN (735 996). Some charges apply to cover the costs of preparing and scanning files.

Bookings to view a file at the Council offices can be made from two to 14 days in advance. Booking times will depend on availability and an appointment will be confirmed by the records team. People requesting an electronic copy of a file will be sent a download link, which remains active for seven days.

#### **PRIVATE PLAN CHANGES**

Kirwee Central Properties Limited have lodged a private plan change application (PC 60) to rezone approximately 17 ha of land at Kirwee from Living 2A to Living 1, to allow for more intensive residential development. The subject land is located within the Kirwee township, south of Hoskyns Road, north of State Highway 73 (West Coast Road) and east of

School Lane and Walter Place. D Marshall, L Martin & A Formosa, M & T Saunders, B Hammett and J & S Howson have lodged a private plan change application (PC 62) to rezone approximately 60 ha of land on the western side of Leeston to facilitate the future development of approximately 410 residential sites. The subject land generally bounded by High Street to the south, Harmans Road to the west, Leeston

Dunsandel Road to the north, with a small area lying north of this road, and Ellesmere College and residential development on Spring Place and Mountain View Place to the east.

Submissions are now open to enable you to have your say on these rezoning proposals. #### PROPOSED LEASE LINCOLN

The Council is proposing to grant a new ground lease to Men's Shed of Lincoln Society Incorporated to allow for an extension to its building on part of the land situated near

the Lincoln Event Centre. The Men's Shed of Lincoln plans to extend its existing facility, which is used as a community meeting place, and for sharing skills for repairing and making items for the community. A lease was previously granted on 14 June 2017 and the new lease would incorporate the extension. This is pursuant to Section 54(1) of the Reserves Act 1977. A copy of the lease document and site plan are available for inspection at Council's Rolleston Headquarters during normal office hours. # Huge response to crafts for animals

Hundreds of fabric pouches, nests, mittens and other items will be helping injured and orphaned animals thanks to knitting and sewing enthusiasts.

There has been a huge response from Selwyn residents to the Selwyn Libraries offer of patterns and the use of its premises and machines to people who wanted to sew and knit items such as joey pouches and mittens for animals affected by the Australian fires, Senior Arts, Culture and Lifelong Learning Co-ordinator Hayley Browne says

"We've been overwhelmed by the response locally and nationally. We've had people from all over the country contact us to help.

More than 250 items have been made in or collected by the libraries and are being stored ready to transport to wherever they are needed. The idea came after library staff saw the response online from people wanting to support the Animal Rescue Craft Guild's work and decided to offer the space and resources for them to help out in some way, Hayley says.

Any items which aren't needed in Australia will be donated to other animal welfare groups who have a need for them, she says.
