

A wilderness garden party with Santa, lolly scrambles and friendly, fun games is helping build community spirit in Prebbleton.

This was the third year a neighbourhood pre-Christmas picnic has been held at the Wilderness Green in Prebbleton. Around 40 people attended the picnic, supported by the Council's Meet Your Street fund for neighbourhood events.

Emma McMulkin, who helps organise the Prebbleton event, says it started out as a one-off get together for members of a mums' group in The Woods subdivision to celebrate at the end of the year, and quickly snowballed into an annual event.

"We have games and families compete to take home a games trophy. We have new games each year. Last year we did tug of war and the three-legged race, the year before we had all the dads lined and the kids painted on shaving foam to form Santa's beard, the kids then threw cotton balls with the aim of sticking as many as they could to their dad's 'beard'. It definitely created a lot of laughs, especially for the mums watching!"

The event is a fun way to welcome new families to the area and build a good community spirit, with new families joining every year, she says.

"It brings everyone together and creates that bond, it's fantastic to see those friendships develop between the kids. One of the things we love about living in Prebbleton, and The Woods subdivision, is everyone has got to know one another well over the years and the picnic is just a great way to celebrate Christmas together".

The Council's Meet Your Street funding helped keep the picnic open to subdivision families, Mrs McMulkin says.

"It means we're not relying on people to front up with cash right before Christmas. It takes some pressure off everyone."

The Council's Meet your Street fund has up to \$75 per event available for people in the Selwyn community who would like to host a local street gathering, neighbourhood sports event or local kids treasure hunt.

On the Roads

Hoskyns Road will be closed at the intersection with State Highway 73 until 28 February while Waka Kotahi NZTA carries out intersection safety improvements. A detour via Sandy Knolls Road is in place.

Night works will be taking place on Rolleston Drive and Dryden Avenue from 7pm – 7am until Friday 12 February to install a new water main and lay the surface for the new intersection. Rolleston Drive will be closed between Kidman Street and McCauley, and Dryden Avenue will be closed between Rolleston Drive and Overbury Street each night. Detours will be in place.

Night works will be taking place to resurface Jones Road between Hoskyns Road and Two Chain Road from Monday 8 to Friday 12 February. Seal widening work is taking place on Walkers Road from Tuesday 9 February. Pavement repairs are taking place on Selwyn Road, Springs Road, Birches Road, Te Pirita Road, Leaches Road and Bealey Road.

Traffic management will be in place for these works. Please follow all on site signage.

Sky's no limit with community fund support

The sky's no limit for young people in Selwyn, thanks to support from the Selwyn Community Fund.

The fund, which started in 2018, supports community groups to run a project, event, or initiative for people in Selwyn.

Canterbury Glider Club Grants Coordinator Mike Marra says support from the Community Fund provided seed funding for a solo glider to use for teaching young people in the district and around Canterbury to fly.

It means, after several years without, the club has a dedicated single seater glider for youth to train in. The glider can also be used for school visits, giving Selwyn young people a hands-on introduction to gliding.

Rolleston teen Jack Clapham, 14, made his first solo flight in the glider at the annual Youth Glide Soaring Development camp at a youth glide camp in Omarama in December last year.

Solo flying is a life changing experience for young people like Jack, Mr Marra says.

"It gives the kids an unbelievable amount of confidence. I've watched kids come through the camp – they can be quite shy, and two weeks later they're gliding by themselves. You see them the next year and they're a totally different person. They're not allowed to drive, but you're giving them the responsibility to fly and it's really inspiring what it does for their personal growth."

While gliding can seem out of reach, the club and Youth Glide New Zealand provide subsidies for youth members to help make it attainable. The experience can lead to great opportunities, with pilots with gliding experience being highly sought after by airlines, he says.

Former youth glide member Nick Oakley, from Selwyn, has competed in gliding competitions internationally, while others have become professional pilots, including former All Black captain Richie McCaw.

Applications for funding from the Selwyn Community Fund are accepted all year round, but there are four dates in the year when applications are assessed and funds released. New intersection opening in Rolleston

The opening of the new Rolleston Drive, Dryden Avenue, Norman Kirk Drive intersection and the Markham Way extension has been delayed to next week.

The intersection was due to open this week, but because of weather and site delays it is now due to open on Thursday 18 or Friday 19 February

The upgrade has seen Norman Kirk Drive realigned, with traffic lights installed at the new intersection of Norman Kirk Drive, Rolleston Drive and Dryden Avenue.


The extension of Markham Way, and the new intersection of Markham Way and Norman Kirk Drive will be opened at the same time.

The new intersection will improve traffic flow on Rolleston Drive, supporting access to the Christchurch Southern Motorway, and the Selwyn Health Hub on Norman Kirk Drive. It will also provide extra safety for pedestrians crossing Rolleston Drive.

The Markham Way extension will also support access to the Rolleston town centre and the traffic flow

Traffic on Norman Kirk Drive will have the right of way over traffic exiting Markham Way, which will need to give way. Please drive carefully and observe all traffic signs and directions.

We appreciate people's patience with the road works required while this work has been carried out.
