

The final flooring is going down and the first events are being confirmed as the Selwyn Sports Centre moves closer to opening

The sprung-wooden floor for the John F Reid Courts at the Selwyn Sports Centre is being installed, as the building moves towards opening in time for the winter sports season.

Selwyn Sports Centre Manager Dave Tippett says the Council has begun working with key users of the centre on bookings for sports including basketball, futsal, netball and floorball and with the

"We've had lots of interest and excitement from sports groups. Now it's just about working out the jigsaw of who wants to use the space when. But we've got an exciting programme starting to shape up."

The New Zealand Secondary Schools Schick Southern Cup Basketball tournament in September is the first tournament confirmed, with discussions under way around hosting other possible tournaments including regional and South Island wide events.

The John F Reid Courts are named after former New Zealand Cricketer, national sports administrator and Council staff member John Reid, who championed the building and oversaw the early stages of construction.

The four courts will be able to host basketball, netball, futsal, volleyball, badminton, and other sports.

The Selwyn Sports Centre also features a hall with four synthetic multipurpose courts, an indoor walking track, meeting rooms and a New Zealand-first interactive digital play wall.

Pedestrian crossing to link pool

Drive in Rolleston, to help people make the most of new sport and recreation services

The crossing has been installed across the existing raised platform between Foster Park and the Selwyn Aquatic Centre. The crossing will support the links between the Selwyn Aquatic Centre and Foster Park, particularly the new Selwyn Sports Centre, opening this autumn. It will also benefit children and families walking to and from schools in the area.

It's important for pedestrians and drivers to be aware and careful around the new crossing and for parents to teach children how to use the crossing safely, Council Road Safety Coordinator Jessica

"Pedestrians have the right of way at a zebra crossing, but it is important to make sure cars have seen you and have stopped. Do not step out if there is a car between you and the diamond that is line marked on the road. Drivers also need to stay alert, slow down and be prepared to stop, as children in particular can be distracted."

Look out for others – pick up your dog's poo

We love welcoming dogs to our parks, but please be considerate of other park users and clean up your dog's poo, especially around sports fields.

The Council has noticed an increase in instances of dog poo not being cleaned up around parks, particularly the sports fields at Foster Park.

With summer sport in full swing this has led to unpleasant situations for sports teams as well as other park users.

The Council is asking people to please be mindful of others using our parks, particularly children.

While dogs are allowed off lead in most Selwyn parks and reserves, dogs do need to be under effective control and dog owners are required to clean up after their dog. Owners can be fined \$300 if their dog leaves a deposit and they don't clean it up.

Dogs must also be on a lead within five metres of a playground, public events, hard court recreation areas including skate parks, and sports fields when there's sport being played.
