Children from all over Selwyn are contributing to the design of Rolleston's new civic centre, Te Ara Ātea.

Nine schools have been involved in creating feature poles and decorative tiles for the sensory space next door to Te Ara Ātea, which opens in Rolleston's new town centre on Tennyson Street in November.

The sensory space poles feature a range of themes from representing unique school character to the region's landscape, flora, birdlife, and environment.

Teacher Leona Whittington said the children at West Rolleston Primary School put in a huge effort to overcome persistent wet weather and competing lunch hour projects.

"Our wee art club is so proud of their effort. They really put in so much time and had the best attitudes throughout the whole process."

Ms Whittington was especially grateful to Andy Benn, the school's "amazing caretaker", for his untiring help.

Te Ahi Kaikōmako (Rolleston) School pupils, Alice and Keira, said their feature pole "symbolises our school culture".

Students at their school strived to show 'e $t\bar{u}$ tāngata' and the school values of being kind, responsible, respectful, connected and resilient.

The school's name originates from the tale of how Maui brought fire to the world and the kaikōmako tree, which Maui used to start the fire, is depicted on the sensory pole, they said.

"Our school and staff are the fire that nourishes our learning," they explained.

The decorative tiles were painted by Waitaha School.

Council Project Manager Phil Millar says the tiles will form a ring around a tree in the sensory space.

Selwyn water systems rank among the best

Selwyn has some of the cheapest water in New Zealand and among the least leaky networks in the country, a new report shows.

Selwyn had the cheapest volumetric water charge in Aotearoa in 2019/20 and among the lowest overall charges for 200m³ of water according to the latest Water New Zealand National Performance Report.

The annual report is compiled by Water New Zealand, an independent not-for-profit organisation representing water professionals and organisations.

The report showed the district's wastewater network has the newest pipes on average and among the lowest rate of overflows per capita in the country. Selwyn was also among the councils with the fewest wastewater complaints.

The district's annual wastewater rate was above the national average, which has helped support investment in the system.

The report showed Selwyn has some of the highest water usage in the country at around 498 litres per person per day. The Council is working to encourage users to think more carefully and be intentional around water use, aiming for continuous improvement in water usage across the district in coming years. The Council has agreed to put more emphasis on volumetric charges in coming years, giving ratepayers more control over their water bills and offering a financial incentive for reducing water wastage.

Selwyn was slightly above the average for unplanned water supply interruptions. The majority were on rural restricted water schemes, where the Council is working on extra storage to improve reliability in coming years.

Council Infrastructure Group Manager Murray Washington says it's good to see how the district's systems measure up.

"We've put a lot of investment into our water and wastewater network in the past few years and it's good to see that reflected in the results, along with some things for us to keep working on to maintain an excellent water and wastewater system for Selwyn."

Have your say on the State Highway 1 Rolleston flyover and speed limits

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency wants to hear your views on transport improvements for Rolleston and current SH1 speed limits, between Hoskyns Road and Dunsandel.

The upgrades are part of the government's \$125m* New Zealand Upgrade Programme for Rolleston to help create a future-focused network for everyone – freight, commuters, rail, cyclists, pedestrians and public transport users.

The proposals include a flyover between the Rolleston township and industrial hub, closing SH1 Hoskyns Road and Rolleston Drive North intersections and removing the level crossing—to be replaced by the flyover. A southbound service lane parallel to SH1 from Rolleston Drive North to south of Brookside Road, would provide access to Rolleston town (left in/left out only for safety). Also proposed is a roundabout at SH1/Dunns Crossing Road/Walkers Road intersection to improve safety and access to southern Rolleston and for freight travelling to and from the industrial area.

Construction is planned to start around 2024 and be completed around 2026.

Waka Kotahi is also asking for feedback on current speed limits along SH1 from Hoskyns Road through to Dunsandel to help decide whether changes need to be considered before the proposed infrastructure is built.

This length of highway has a high number of people killed and seriously injured in crashes. No new speeds are proposed – the purpose is to hear community views on current speeds. If changes are recommended, Waka Kotahi will consult with the community near the end of this year. Any changes would be made in 2022.

Waka Kotahi will keep people informed and work together with project partners – iwi, Council and KiwiRail.

Innovative series returns to help young drivers learn over winter

A popular driving series is back, helping young drivers learn the road code and encourage them to gain more experience in winter driving conditions.

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and ACC are running the Drive Winter Series until 8 August, building on the success of the Drive Summer Series campaign, with young drivers incentivised to complete road code units and practice tests on the website drive.govt.nz and track drives in the Drive Go smart phone app.

People will earn points and entries into prize draws, with smartphones and driving lessons to be won.

Ensuring young drivers develop broad experience while on their learner licence, with their coach or parent in the passenger seat, is vital to reducing the risk of them being involved in a serious crash, once they are driving unsupervised on their restricted licence and is a focus of the series.

Drive is a free, learn-to-drive programme helping young people get their licence and develop the right habits for a lifetime of safe driving.

Flood recovery support available

Applications are open for a \$4 million fund from the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) to help floodaffected farmers and growers in Canterbury.

The financial support will help farmers and growers affected by May's floods to get back on their feet.

Grants will assist farmers to clear flood debris from their paddocks, such as shingle, boulders, trees, and silt.

Applications can be made for clean-up work already undertaken. Distribution of grants will be determined once all applications have been received.

Applications will be assessed by an independent panel that sector groups have helped select.

MPI will contribute up to half of the clean-up cost for uninsurable works.
