

Local elections are coming up in October and the deadline for checking you're enrolled to vote is coming up soon.

Selwyn residents 18 or older and who are a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident are eligible to vote, if they are enrolled on the parliamentary electoral roll.

But you need to make sure your enrolments details are correct by Friday 12 August.

Everyone on the electoral roll should have received an enrolment pack from the Electoral Commission last month. If your details were correct – then you don't need to do anything.

If you haven't received an enrolment update pack in the mail by now it may mean you're not enrolled, or your details are not up to date. This could be because you've recently moved into the district, changed addresses, or have turned 18 – and you'll need to update your details. To enrol or update your details, visit vote.nz or call 0800 36 76 56.

You can also check a copy of the preliminary electoral roll at the Council offices or any Selwyn library, as well as the Arthur's Pass Store, Dunsandel Store, or Tai Tapu Store.

If you miss the 12 August deadline, but you're eligible to vote, you can still vote but you'll have to request special voting papers from the Council's electoral officer.

If you own property in Selwyn district but live in another district you may be able to enrol as a non-resident ratepayer elector and vote in both areas. Check your eligibility and get more information at the Ratepayer Elector Enrolment Portal on the Council's website at selwyn.govt.nz/elections.

Selwyn deputy electoral officer Stephen Hill is encouraging residents to check their enrolment early and make sure they have everything in order to be able to vote.

"Councils get to make decisions that affect every Selwyn resident, and have a big impact on the community – including the services that residents receive and what they cost," he says.

"Local elections are your chance to have a say and help shape Selwyn's future."

### New toilet funding a boost for visitor experience

Visitors to several popular Selwyn locations will enjoy a more comfortable experience after the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment approved funding for toilet and car park upgrades.

Nearly \$300,000 has been granted from MBIE's Tourism Infrastructure Fund for new or upgraded toilets at the Darfield Grain Shed, Waimakariri Gorge and the Little River Rail Trail, and car park improvements at Joyce Reserve in Glentunnel, and at Lake Lyndon Reserve.

The existing old concreate toilet block at the Grain Shed, beside the historic jail site in Darfield, will be demolished and a new block installed.

At Waimakariri Gorge the existing facility will also be replaced with a new one, and the location will be moved closer to the road access.

On the Little River Rail Trail a brand new toilet block will be built about midway between Lincoln and Motukarara, close to the Ahuriri Lagoon.

Council Community Projects manager Cam Warr says this facility will be a welcome addition for cyclists, who otherwise face a 15 kilometre stretch between the two settlements.

The rest stop car parks at Joyce Reserve and Lake Lyndon Reserve will be sealed.

In Darfield, the township committee has supported the toilet upgrade at the Grain Shed site, which is well used by the local community and visitors to the historic Darfield Jail.

Cam says the TIF funding has made a big difference to visitor facilities around the district in recent years. "It has been really valuable in allowing us to improve and enhance the experience of travellers and tourists exploring our district," he says.

"It's amazing how much we have managed to achieve with this fund – either bringing forward projects to upgrade assets earlier or putting place new assets we would otherwise have struggled to fund."

Previous TIF projects have included campground and toilet upgrades at locations including Lakeside Domain, Coes Ford, Lake Coleridge, Hororata Domain and Springston.

# Rates accounts and payment options

Rates invoices for the period 1 July 2022 to 30 September 2023 should have arrived in your letterboxes or inboxes.

You can check out the changes in your rates, by visiting selwyn.govt.nz/rates and clicking on property search.

If you pay by direct debit, you should have received information on your new direct debit in a separate letter. If you're on direct debit then, provided you have sufficient funds in your bank account to cover the payments on the due dates, you will not be charged penalties.

For ratepayers not on a direct debit, rates are payable in four instalments – 15 September 2022, 15 December 2022, 15 March 2023 and 15 June 2023. Penalties are charged on instalments not paid in full by the due dates and there is a further penalty if rates are not paid by 30 June 2023

Your rates invoice details the rates assessed for your property for both the Council and Environment Canterbury. The Council assesses a general rate, based on your property's capital value, district-wide targeted rates, plus other targeted rates based on where you live, or the services you receive. We also act as agent for the collection of Environment Canterbury rates within Selwyn.

The average rates increase for the 2022/23 year is 6%, however this will vary for individual properties. Rates take account of capital values, as well any changes to your property, for example if you have built a house on your section, or if you have changed your wheelie bins.

#### Apply for a rates rebate

Ratepayers who are on a low income and who pay rates on the property they live in may be eligible for a rates rebate.

If your gross household income to 31 March 2022 was \$28,080 or less, and you pay rates on the property where you live, you may qualify for a rebate.

If your income was more than this, you may still be eligible, depending on the total cost of your rates and the number of dependents in your family.

To find out if you are eligible for a rates rebate, and to download forms, visit rates rebates.govt.nz. Forms are also available from Council service centres. If you received a rates rebate last year you will automatically be sent an application form.

To apply, you will need to provide accurate details and copies of your gross income, and that of any partner/spouse/joint homeowner who lives with you, for the tax year ended 31 March 2022. You can apply for your rebate at any Council service centre.

#### Rabbit control operation Rhodes Park

A rabbit control operation is under way in Rhodes Park, Tai Tapu Domain. The operation, using baited carrots in the bush area, will run until mid-August (weather dependent). Rabbits are a continuing problem in the park causing damage to plants and playing fields. Night shooting and trapping have not been effective in controlling the pest. Park users should not touch baited carrots (they will be green in colour) or allow dogs to eat or remove them.

Domestic animals are less susceptible than rabbits but may still be at risk from large doses.

#### On the Roads

Darfield Kirwee Wastewater Pipeline - Courtenay Road closure Courtenay Road in Kirwee, from just south of the railway line to SH73, remains closed until early September. Vehicle access between Kirwee and properties to the south is via a detour along Bealey Road. Pedestrian access is available from Courtenay Road direct to the township. The closure is for the installation of pipes under the railway line and will be the last one

required as part of this project.
The final stage of the project will be the installation of the pipeline under SH73 at the pumpstation site

in Kirwee. This will happen once Courtenay Road is reopened. Traffic lights will be in place while that work is under way, but no road closure. All completion dates are approximate depending on weather

#### Weedons Ross Road seal widening

The road is now fully open to two-way traffic from Kingsdowne Drive to Maddisons Road. A shoulder closure is now in place for Orion contract works, on the Newtons Road intersection through to early August. Manual four-way stop/go will be required on some days. Please follow signs and controls for the safety of all road users and workers.

#### Other repairs and upgrades

Flood damage repairs are continuing in a number of locations across the district including Wainiwaniwa Road, Algidus Road, Kowai Road, Whitecliffs Road. Ford repairs are continuing at Adams Road, Storeys Road and Lambs Road, and these fords are closed.

Unsealed road maintenance and grading are under way at Northbank Road, Rakaia Selwyn Road, and Burnham School road
