

Property owners in Selwyn will soon receive an updated rateable value for their property.

The revaluation was carried out by Quotable Value (QV) on behalf of the Council. It showed a 33.7% average increase in capital values in Selwyn since the previous valuation in 2018 – reflecting the increasing popularity of Selwyn as a place to live.

The valuations are an estimate of the likely price that would have been paid for the property on 1 September 2021.

The new valuations are available to view online at ratingvalues.co.nz or selwyn.govt.nz/ propertysearch. Property owners should receive a letter with their updated property valuation by mid-February.

The new values will be used for calculating rates from 1 July 2022. Most property owners will find the capital value of their property has increased - but this does not mean rates will also increase by a similar amount.

Where a property value has increased more than the average increase in capital value (33.7%) the owner can expect a slightly higher than average increase in their rates from 1 July 2022. Where the capital value increase was less than the average owners can expect a slightly lower than average increase in their rates.

The Council sets rates on 1 July each year based on the amount of income it needs to provide services for residents. The revaluation of all the district's properties doesn't increase the total amount Council collects from rates, it just helps us work out everyone's share of rates.

For most residential properties, around a quarter of their rates bill is based on the capital value of their property, the rest is based on the available services. More information on rates can be found at selwyn.govt.nz/rates.

On average residential values (dwellings, flats and vacant residential land) increased by 47.6%, lifestyle properties by 34.6% and dairy and pastoral properties by 12.5%.

Value changes varied across the largest towns. Average values increased by 46.6% in Prebbleton, 44.1% in Rolleston, 31.4% in Darfield and 31.3% in Lincoln. West Melton increased by 44.7%, Leeston by 37.2%, Tai Tapu by 31.1% and Southbridge by 26.3%. Residential values in the rural areas of Malvern increased by 41.3% and in rural areas of Ellesmere by 35.6%.

Property owners can object to their valuation. Objections must be lodged with QV by 17 March 2022. Information on how to make an objection can be found in the letter to property owners or online at ratingvalues.co.nz.

## Be safe with pest control traps

We're reminding Selwyn residents to be safe when it comes to the laying of pest control traps.

Gin traps have been found in the Hororata and Dunsandel cemeteries three times in the past six months. These traps are illegal and dangerous and the police have been notified about the incidents.

These traps should not be used anywhere – however they are particularly dangerous on public land where people can be caught in these traps and harmed. In one recent case a trap was discovered by a small child who was at risk of being seriously injured.

Animal traps are also not allowed on public land except with the agreement of the landowner – usually the Council or the Department of Conservation.

Any traps discovered on Council property will be removed and illegal traps such as gin traps will be reported to police.

The Council runs pest control operations on its properties and works with community groups and individuals to support pest eradication. It is open to working further with people on this as a partner in the Predator Free New Zealand 2050 goal.

# Batteries can't go in your kerbside bins

Batteries placed in kerbside bins are a fire hazard, they can and do catch fire in the rubbish trucks and at the Pines Resource Recovery Park. Already this year there have been two fires from batteries, one at the Pines Resource Recovery Park and another in one of our trucks, which led to seven tonnes of recycling having to be diverted to landfill.

In Selwyn we have a free battery recycling programme. Batteries can be dropped off at the Pines Resource Recovery Park, Darfield Library, New World Lincoln, and New World Rolleston.

We accept household quantities of the following battery types:

- · Lithium-ion (used in laptops, mobile phones, tools)
- · Alkaline, dry cell and zinc (used in flashlights, radios, remote controls, smoke detectors)
- · Button cell/coin (used in watches, hearing aids)
- · Nickel-cadmium (used in portable electronics, tools, toys)
- Nickel-metal hydride (used in digital cameras, laptops, mobile phones)

## On the Roads

Tennyson Street is closed from south of 75 Tennyson Street (the Police Station) to 78 Tennyson Street and Rolleston Drive is one-way westbound for the upgrade of the Tennyson Street and Rolleston Drive

intersection. Detours are in place.

Burnham Road is closed to northbound traffic north of the Burnham School Road intersection to State Highway 1 from 10 January to 26 April. A detour will be in place.

Seal widening is taking place on Weedons Ross Road from Kingsdowne Drive to Johnsons Road. Weedons Ross Road will be one-way open to traffic travelling south (towards Rolleston). A detour is in place.

Pre-seal repairs are taking place on Waterholes Road between SH1 and Hamptons Road and Trents Road between SH1 and SH76, Bridge Road between Greendale Road and Coaltrack Road and on Bealey Road between Warrens Road and Lambs Road. Repairs are taking place on Telegraph Road from Essendon Road to Bealey Road. Pavement repairs are taking place on Wards Road between Highfield Road and Kerrs Road.

Soakhole construction is taking place on Boundary Road between Waterholes Road and Shands Road, Jowers Road between SH73 and Curraghs Road, Wards Road between Tresillian Drive and Kerrs Road and on Hobbs Street.

## PROPOSAL TO CHANGE CLASSIFICATION OF A RESERVE – SOUTHBRIDGE

The Selwyn District Council is proposing to change the classification of approximately 8094m2 of Local Purpose (Town Depot) Reserve, being Reserve 4918, at 23 St John Street, Southbridge held in Record of Title CB777/38, to approximately 3719 square meters of Local Purpose (Utility) Reserve and approximately 4375 square meters of Local Purpose (Landscape) Reserve.

Part of the Reserve is currently being used for a water treatment facility. This facility is reaching capacity and the Council needs to increase storage for the township supply. Council proposes that the balance of the land which is undeveloped should be classified as a Local Purpose (Landscape) Reserve. The change of classification

will correctly identify both areas for their primary purpose and values.
