

FIND OUT HOW TO STAND FOR SELWYN

Anyone who's thought about taking a stand to have a say in the future of Selwyn can find out more about standing to be a community board member, a councillor or even the mayor.

The Council will be holding four workshops between 28 June and 5 July for prospective candidates in this year's local government elections.

"This is an opportunity for people interested in standing in the 2022 elections to learn more about the nomination and election processes and the roles of councils and elected members. It's also a chance to have any questions answered," says Council Chief Executive David Ward.

Candidate workshops will be held from 7-8.30pm at the following dates and locations:

- * Tuesday 28 June West Melton Community and Recreation Centre * Wednesday 29 June Darfield Recreation Centre
- * Thursday 30 June Council offices, Rolleston * Tuesday 5 July Leeston Library.

"We are encouraging anyone who wants to make a difference in the local community to take a stand. Local government and local democracy are fundamental to our community and we need a range of elected members of different ages, ethnicities and backgrounds to represent the diversity of our community.

Anyone aged over 18 can stand for election as long as they are a New Zealand citizen, enrolled on the Selwyn electoral roll and nominated by two people over the age of 18 who are also enrolled to vote in the area the candidate is planning to stand.

In the 2022 local elections 10 councillors will be elected across four wards - Ellesmere (2), Malvern (2), Rolleston (3) and Springs (3).

Five community board members will be elected to the Malvern Community Board, in three subdivisions - Hawkins (2), Tawera (1) and West Melton (2). The Mayor is elected 'at large' across the

The election is held by postal vote, opening on Friday 16 September and closing at midday on Saturday 8 October.

Nominations for candidates open on 15 July 2022 and close at 12 noon on 12 August 2022.

Council supports improved access for all

A new card to improve access is now being used at all Council

The Hāpai Access Card is now accepted at all Council facilities, allowing staff to better support people with disabilities to access and use the Council's services.

The scheme has been in use in Aotearoa New Zealand for 18 months, based on a similar system running in the United Kingdom.

It uses a card that the holder can show a participating organisation. Icons on the card show what assistance a person may need, helping the organisation to provide the appropriate support. Staff have been trained to support card holders.

The icons on each card are unique to the holder and their needs and provide a discreet way for people to indicate to Council staff what they need to help them best use the facility and services.



Group Manager Community Services and Facilities Denise Kidd says the cards fit well with the Council's commitment to accessibility in its Accessibility Charter.

"Our facilities and our services are for all our residents and anyone who needs them," she says "We want to make sure that everyone feels welcome and is able to use our services and get the full benefits of them. The Hapai Access Card is another way that we can be more welcoming and help reduce the barriers that make it harder for people to use our services.

It was encouraging to see the way Council staff welcomed the initiative and the Council's wider accessibility work, Hapai Access Card Executive Manager Susan Jackson says

"It has been great to have the opportunity to onboard Selwyn District Council's sites to the Hāpai Access Card. Two things that impress me; Firstly the willingness of the operations staff to embrace this tool for improving accessibility, and secondly the commitment of the property and building staff to up the standard, and to continue to improve accessibility in Council buildings".

On the Roads

Aylesbury Road between SH1 and Burdons Road is one way northbound from SH1 until 1 July. Courtenay Road between Miles Road and Kirwee (SH73) is closed until 22 July.

Council approves land rezoning for residential development in Lincoln

The Council has approved rezoning of 190 hectares of rural land south of Lincoln for residential development.

The decision follows the independent Commissioner's recommendation to approve the Private Plan Change 69 request (PC69), which Rolleston Industrial Developments Ltd lodged with the Council 18

The next step in the process is to publicly notify the Council's decision – which is expected to be on 22

"Those who submitted during the public consultations - and the applicants - will have 30 working days to make an appeal to the Environment Court once the decision is notified," says Council's Environmental and Regulatory Services Group Manager Tim Harris.

If an appeal is received, the Environment Court will hold the hearings and make the final decision.

The Council ran two rounds of public consultation on the private plane change request, and received 255 submissions and seven further submissions. A total of 66 submitters gave evidence at the subsequent

"In response to the Council's and submitters' concerns a number of changes have been made to the original request," Mr Harris says.

These changes include a reduction in the number of possible residential sites, from around 2,000 to around 1,700; more commercial land that can cater for community and educational facilities; and changes to address traffic volumes.

Since 2020 when the National Policy Statement On Urban Development (NPS-UD) was introduced the Council has received 16 private plan change requests for rezoning land across the district which, if all approved, would enable around 10,000 further residential sites across the eastern areas of the district.

Without the NPS-UD the Council would have likely rejected most, if not all, of the private plan change requests before they had continued to be processed. This is because they wouldn't have met the provisions of the Regional Policy Statement.

"We are required to process private plan change requests, such as PC69, as a result of the new national policy framework," Mr Harris says.
