Here's the plan ...have your say

Annual Plan 2022/23

You can now have you say on the Council's proposed plans for the next 12 months.

Consultation on the Annual Plan is now open until 19 May. The Council is seeking your feedback on four key projects and how we're tracking overall with the plan agreed last year through the Long-Term Plan 2021-2031.

Mayor Sam Broughton says the Council's focus for the year is on delivering in the key areas identified by the community for focus through the Long-Term Plan.

"We'll be continuing with projects we outlined last year to provide the essential services and facilities our rapidly-growing district needs. In previous consultations you have told us that things like safe, well-maintained roads, good quality drinking water and community facilities are important for our quality of life – so we're keeping our focus on these areas."

The proposed average rates increase is 6%, slightly higher than the 4.9% increase forecast in the Long-Term Plan, but in line with the current rate of inflation and taking into account the increased costs for the Council from fuel costs, supply chain delays and the tight labour market.

Proposed rates changes will vary for individual properties depending on their type and location.

"We've worked hard to limit the average rates increase, while still ensuring it delivers the essential services and facilities our rapidly-growing district needs," Mayor Broughton says.

The plan proposes \$91m to capital projects – \$20.2m in water supply projects; \$21.6m in wastewater projects; and \$20.4m in transportation projects.

The Council is also seeking feedback on four key proposals:

- a change in proposal for the funding of the Hororata Community Club,
- · closure of parts of the Upper Ellesmere Water Race,
- · changes to water race rating across the district, and
- a proposal for investing in biodiversity through a \$20 Ecological Enhancement targeted rate and harmonisation of Land Drainage rates.

During the consultation period councillors and staff will also be attending drop-in sessions and community events where residents can ask questions and share their views. You can find the plan and details of these events at selwyn.govt.nz/annualplan22.

New locations to collect RATs

The Canterbury District Health Board's Rolleston RAT Collection Centre has moved to the Toka Hapāi Selwyn Health Hub on Norman Kirk Drive.

The collection centre is open 1-5pm, Monday to Friday. With car parking available on site, people are asked to park and walk up and collect their pre-ordered RATs from the marquee.

For those in rural areas the Council has worked with the DHB and our Civil Defence Community Response Teams to set up 19 distribution points in rural and remote areas with team members arranging contactless delivery or pick up for people in their area who need them.

These include: Arthur's Pass, Castle Hill, Lake Coleridge, Springfield, Sheffield, Waddington, Whitecliffs, Glentunnel, Coalgate, Dunsandel township, Kaianga/Dunsandel, Bankside, Southbridge, Rakaia Huts, Lakeside, Brookside/Irwell, Selwyn Huts, Greenpark, Motukarara.

On the Roads

Tennyson Street Rolleston Drive Intersection Upgrade

A give-way roundabout control is in place for the intersection until the traffic lights have been commissioned. The intersection is closed from 9pm-6am until Friday - weather permitting - to complete work that requires a full intersection closure. Detours will be in

place. Access to the Tennyson Street and Rolleston Drive shops and shopping centre car parking will be restricted at times during this work.

Darfield Kirwee Wastewater Pipeline project

Burnham Road is one-way southbound between State Highway 1 and Burnham School Road until 26 April. A detour will be in place.

Aylesbury Road between SH1 and Two Chain Road is one-way northbound from SH1 until late April. Ansons Road is closed from Miles Road to Poll Road and works are taking place at the Miles Road, Bealey Road, Highfield Road intersection with traffic management in place. Weedons Ross Road seal widening

Weedons Ross Road is one-way open to traffic travelling south (towards Rolleston), for the duration of the project. The work area is currently from Johnsons Road to Finlays Road and will move south as sections are completed. A detour is in place. Please follow the one-way system for the safety of all road users and workers.

Other repairs and upgrades

Repairs are taking place on Telegraph Road between Essendon Road and Bealey Road and on Old West Coast Road between Cooks Road and Ansons Road and Redmonds Road and Pinegrove Road. Traffic management is in place for these works.
