

A celebration of the sounds, flavours and fun of cultures from around the world is returning to Selwyn this week.

CultureFest is back for its annual celebration at Lincoln Domain on Sunday 10 September 10am to 2pm — kicking off three weeks of celebration.

Experience the flavours of food from 28 different cultures stretching from Bulgaria to Korea, Nigeria, Japan and beyond and enjoy top performances or have a go yourself with sports, games, dance, songs and more from 18 different cultures taking in Aotearoa to India, Tuvalu to Brazil.

The event will kick off a series of events over the next two weeks, celebrating the many cultures that make up the district.

Everything from Henna Art and Kapa Haka classes to musical performances, and more will be on offer at events across the district.

With new events such as hair braiding and sushi making through to the return of the popular women's only swimming night at Selwyn Aquatic centre, the series will have something for everyone.

Selwyn Mayor Sam Broughton says CultureFest is a high point on the Selwyn calendar.

"CultureFest is such a fun and enjoyable time of the year, embracing the many different people that bring colour and life to our district. Over the years the community has really got behind the event and made it a great day out and it's been good to see how people are enjoying the wider event series."

Faces of Selwyn relives traditions

To celebrate CultureFest and the many migrants that choose to call Selwyn their home, Faces of Selwyn returns for its third time on air.

The popular series engaged a total of 1,527 listeners last year, an increase of 100 listeners from 2021. These numbers are expected to rise again this year.

This year is the first year the series has come full circle, by reintroducing a student collaboration.

In the series' first year in 2019, the University of Canterbury (UC) Journalism Diploma students helped write the stories.

Three New Zealand Broadcasting School students; Charlotte Mulder, Katie Oliver and Davina Zimmer have stepped onboard to host Faces of Selwyn 2023.

Council's Communications Advisor, former UC Journalism student and host, Hayley Tate says it feels good to pass the baton on.

"I think it's an amazing opportunity for these students. I hope they make the most of it."

Broadcasting student Davina says the experience so far has been incredibly rewarding.

"To be able to sit down with these individuals and listen to their stories of how they came to call Selwyn home is so interesting. You read about Aotearoa having a high population of immigrants, but this project puts faces to the numbers which is really nice."

This year's participant Becky Buada from the Philippines says she loved the opportunity to share her journey about what brought her to Selwyn and why she lives here now.

Find out more about changes being proposed to how we prepare for and manage emergencies.

The Council is running a workshop on Wednesday 13 September to learn more about the Government's proposed new Emergency Management Bill.

The workshop is open to the public to observe and learn about the bill and how you can make a public submission, if you wish.

The new bill aims to bring practical improvements and small changes to update the existing Civil Defence Emergency Management Act 2002.

It aims to ensure improvements such as making sure communities are better prepared to respond to and recover from emergencies and the impacts of emergencies on people, the economy, and the environment are reduced

Some of the key measures in the Bill include:

- improving outcomes for communities disproportionately impacted by emergencies
- enhancing the resilience and accountability of critical infrastructure
- improving operational effectiveness

The workshop will be held at the Council Rolleston Offices 11am-12pm 13 September and streamed online on the Council YouTube channel.

Appeal period extended for **Proposed District Plan decisions**

Council decisions on submissions on the Proposed District Plan were notified last week.

Due to a technical error some submitters were notified of decisions later than intended. As a result the appeal period has been extended. The appeal period will now close at 5pm 6 October 2023.

Any person who made a submission on the Proposed District Plan may appeal the Council's decision to the Environment Court within 30 working days of the service of the notice of decisions. A copy of the appeal must also be served on the Council.
