

New cutting-edge technology to help in the detection of fires is now in place in McHughs Forest Park, Darfield.

The three fire sensor poles were turned on last week at a launch with partners Spark New Zealand and Attentis.

The poles use thermal imaging, 360° cameras, and air quality technology to monitor conditions and notify emergency services if any sign of fire is detected.

The data will also be made live for people to check the conditions in the forest through a QR code on signage at McHughs Forest Park and via the Council website.

Mayor Sam Broughton says the sensors are a positive step to improve safety and enjoyment of the district.

"It's exciting to have this technology available for McHughs Forest and what it could mean for the future of Selwyn. It's a great example of how we can embrace technology to help people explore and enjoy the district, safely."

Spark IoT (Internet of Things) lead Michele Wong says the sensors demonstrate how relevant data and edge processing combined with the appropriate IoT cellular network services can provide situational awareness in areas where speed of information can be hugely important.

"We are excited to work with the Council on the deployment of their early fire detection networks. The project has generated some interest with other councils, commercial forestry operation and other organisations actively considering the technology solution."

Attentis Managing Director Cameron McKenna says, "This technology is instrumental in delivering a proactive response to public safety and I am particularly proud to work alongside a team of individuals who prioritise this."

The partners have also worked with Fire and Emergency New Zealand, District Manager Dave Stackhouse says, "Fire and Emergency NZ has worked collaboratively with Selwyn District Council on this project, and we congratulate them on using technology to help reduce the impact of fire on our community."

The sensors are self-powered and use a combination of artificial intelligence and Internet of Things (IoT) technology — a system of interrelated computers and machines that can transfer data without needing people-to-people or people-to-computer interaction.

# Selwyn residents share thoughts on growth in Huihui Mai

More than 1300 Selwyn residents shared their thoughts on what the future of Greater Christchurch should look like, in the recent Huihui Mai community engagement.

The engagement, run by the Whakawhanake Kāinga Komiti (Urban Growth Partnership for Greater Christchurch) asked residents in Christchurch City, Selwyn and Waimakariri for their views on how to tackle important issues related with growth, the environment and transport over the next 30 years when the population of the area is expected to reach more than 700,000.

In total, 1396 Selwyn residents responded to the survey. Of these:

- 83% agreed with Greater Christchurch having a focus on growth around key urban and town centres, and along public transport routes.
- 24% were open to living in high density housing.
- 19% used public or active transport.

Selwyn residents also said it was important to improve the health of waterways; that more aged care, health and retail facilities were needed locally; and that they would like to see a greenbelt created.

Feedback from Huihui Mai will be used to inform plans about transport, infrastructure and urban planning, which will go out to the public for consultation later this year.

The Whakawhanake Kāinga Komiti Urban Growth Partnership for Greater Christchurch was established last year, bringing together local government, mana whenua and central government to advance shared urban growth objectives.





# Have your say on extending Dog Club training hours at Foster Dog Park

We want to hear from users of the Foster Dog Park and residents in the area about a request to extend the days the Selwyn Dog Club can use the park.

The Selwyn Dog Club has leased an area of the park for training since 2009. The current lease terms allow the club to use a section of the park for training on four days a week — Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights 6.30–9pm and a two-hour class on Sunday mornings. The club is also allowed to have exclusive use of the dog park to host competitions for a maximum of 12 days a year

The club has requested to add an additional training class on Monday nights between 6.30–9pm. The club intends to reduce class sizes to allow trainers to better manage classes and improve parking, both in the car park and the surrounding area. The remainder of the dog park would remain open for use during this time.

## Selwyn has its say on plan for the year

The Council will be considering residents feedback as it works to finalise the plan for the year.

A total of 105 submissions were received on the draft Annual Plan 2023/24 by the close of submissions on Friday last week. Hearings will now be held for submitters who have asked to speak to their submissions.

The submissions will be used to produce a final plan that will be adopted by the Council by

The draft plan outlines what the Council is going to do over the coming year and how much it will cost. It's the third year of the Council's Long-Term Plan 2021-2031.

In addition to the major projects agreed in the Long-Term Plan, the Council is continuing to invest in services, facilities and infrastructure, and other community projects across the district. These include projects such as the new:

- community reserve development in Dunsandel and Darfield
- water treatment plant in Leeston and Prebbleton
- membrane water treatment plant and reservoir in Springfield
- reservoirs in Hororātā and Arthur's Pass
- and intersection upgrades in Lincoln town centre.

To deliver these services and facilities, the plan proposes committing \$137.7 million to capital projects over the next 12 months. This includes \$20.8 million in water supply projects, \$45.8 million in wastewater projects and \$43.5 million in transportation projects.
