

Kick off your Summer in Selwyn with a Season of Fun Events and Activities






Latest updates to District Rule Book Available

The District's rule book has been updated to help people looking for the latest information.

Decisions from public hearings on the proposed District Plan were announced in August with a period of appeals closing in October.

Any parts of the plan that were not appealed are now in effect and the Council has updated the Decisions Version of the Partially Operative Selwyn District Plan with an Appeals Version



The Appeals Version will be updated as appeals are resolved and provisions become operative.

How do we protect and enhance our natural heritage?

Resilient Economy Shows Impressive Growth

Waikirikiri Selwyn remains one of the fastest growing economies in the country, new economic figures show.

Latest figures from economic analysts Infometrics show Selwyn's economy grew by 3.5% GDP over the year to September 2023, making it the third fastest growing territorial authority.

This growth was supported by robust employment and consumer spending. A 5.9% growth in employment of Selwyn residents over the year to September underlines the growing diversity of the Selwyn economy with growth in every industry except agriculture.

This employment surge is underpinned by strong population growth, estimated at 5.2% for the year to June 2023. Consumer spending in Selwyn has seen an impressive increase, with a 12.4% growth over the year to September 2023. This growth accelerated to 15% in the September 2023 quarter, highlighting the district's robust economic health. This trend not only points to economic prosperity, but also signifies a high level of consumer confidence within the district.

While house values in Selwyn experienced a moderate decline, sales were up by 9.1% over the year to September 2023, compared to the 13.7% fall nationally during the same period.

The figures suggest a slow down in new house building, with the 291 new dwellings consented in the September quarter the lowest quarter since 2019. The continued growth in the economy highlights how the district's economy is becoming more diversified and less reliant on construction.

Mayor Sam Broughton expressed optimism about Selwyn's economic trajectory, "Our community's resilience and adaptability are evident in these figures. We remain committed to fostering a vibrant economy that not only grows but does so sustainably, creating opportunities for our residents and businesses alike and supports strengthening our community."

Selwyn Welcomes 129 New Citizens in Recent Ceremonies

Friends, family, and supporters joined in celebration as 129 new citizens were warmly welcomed at two of the Council's latest citizenship ceremonies held at Te Ara Ātea and Tai Tapu in November.

While the majority of our new citizens originated from South Africa (19), India (17), the Philippines (16), and the United Kingdom (12), the global representation spanned 31 different countries, including Nepal, Saudi Arabia, Poland, and Hungary. These newest Kiwis proudly contribute to the 732 individuals welcomed to the Selwyn community in 2023 from 61 countries.

Throughout the year, the success of these ceremonies owes much to the valued presence of special guests, including Councillors, representatives of Ngāi Te Ruahikihiki, the Defence Force and the Christchurch Multicultural Council. The participation of local school children and kapa haka groups

have also made these occasions memorable for our new citizens. Together, they have embraced and celebrated the diverse backgrounds that now enrich Selwyn's community.

Deputy Mayor Lyall who attended the most recent ceremony said, "It was a real privilege to welcome so many new Kiwis and to share such a special and happy occasion with them. Over the year, we have seen a diverse group of people from various corners of the globe, all choosing to make Selwyn their home by becoming New Zealand citizens, which has been truly special.
