Old mill gets new lease of life

A heritage listed Doyleston mill shed has been restored to its former glory, after receiving support from the Selwyn Heritage Fund.

Earlier this year, the 19th century mill shed attached to the property's barn, forming part of the heritage listed Strathlachlan Homestead, was treated to extensive roof, wall and frame repairs helping to preserve the building for future years.

Owners, Deborah Gill-Smith and Andrew Smith completed the work in May, with \$1,500 from the Selwyn Heritage Fund helping to pay for the maintenance.

Deborah says the pair are delighted to have restored the 140-year-old building.

"We're very pleased that the repairs and strengthening have been completed. The mill shed looks fantastic and is reminiscent of what it would have been like when it was first built more than a century ago."

The Strathlachlan Homestead and supporting buildings were constructed in the 1880s, south-west of Doyleston. The homestead is significant because it demonstrates how early Ellesmere farming families lived. The home has remained in the McLachlan family for generations, and its Italianate villa style, popular in 1870s and 1880s, also holds significance.

Deborah and Andrew applied to the Council's Selwyn Heritage Fund last year, to help cover the costs of the repairs.

The Heritage Fund is now open for 2023 applications, and residents who own a heritage listed building or protected tree are encouraged to apply.

The grant is designed to assist owners with work that is needed to maintain or

enhance the district's heritage buildings or protected trees. Criteria and forms can be found online at selwyn.govt.nz/heritagefund. Applications are welcome until Monday 17 July 2023.



Do you know what's likely to happen if an earthquake hits Selwyn, or a tsunami?



As we've seen with recent earthquakes, wildfires and storms here in Selwyn, emergencies can happen anytime and anywhere, and often without warning. It is up to you to make sure you and your family are ready and know what to do. You may need to take care of yourselves for several days, or longer.

The good news is, with a little preparation it's easy to get ready now.

The Selwyn Emergency Management team will be sharing tips about how to be prepared, in an interactive event at Te Ara Ātea this month.

The evening will include information on an Alpine Fault earthquake and the latest tsunami information for Selwyn, along with practical tips and discussions on how you can be ready for an emergency, Selwyn Emergency Management Officer Jason Flewellen says.

"There's lots people can do to be ready and we're here to help with that. It doesn't have to be scary, but it's good to get it sorted so you don't have to worry. We're looking forward to a fun evening, but with a really important message for everyone to hear."

Hit the track and help your learner

A driving course with a difference is back this month providing young drivers and their parents/ caregivers with a practical hands-on learning experience.

Leading Learners is a dynamic driving course for Selwyn teenagers and their parents or caregivers, subsidised by the Council.

The popular course is not your traditional defensive driving, classroom lesson or school-based environment. Taught by a team of qualified driving instructors, it's a half-day event, offering a

practical hands-on learning experience, supporting young drivers and giving adults the opportunity to ride along and learn ways to be a better coach and mentor to their teen.

The learner must have a current New Zealand learner or restricted licence, held for at least three months and around 40 hours of practical driving practice. They must also be accompanied by a parent or caregiver for the full session.
