## **New Citizens Advice Bureau Opening in Darfield**

Selwyn residents will have access to a wealth of information and advice when a new Citizen's Advice Bureau opens in Darfield on 1 July.

The new bureau will open in Darfield from Tuesday 1 July at the Darfield Library and operate every Tuesday from 10am and 2pm.

"The Citizens Advice Bureau service is about helping people to know their rights and responsibilities," says Mollie Howarth, the Citizens Advice Bureau Christchurch Area Manager.

"Our volunteers listen to people and provide them with information and options that help meet their needs," she says.

Volunteers can provide advice on a wide range of topics including consumer rights, education, training, employment, benefits, budgeting, finance, tax, health, counselling, disputes, human rights, housing, tenancy, family, immigration, hobbies, sports and social activities.

Mollie Howarth says that there are many people in Selwyn who may want to use the service, including new residents wanting to find out about what clubs and groups they can join, people who may need advice on budgeting, financial help, childcare and housing or young people wanting information on training and employment options.

The new service is free and no appointment is required. The bureau also stocks a range of information pamphlets. The Citizens Advice Bureau is looking for volunteers who have a couple of hours available a week or a month to help other people in their community.
