## **Library Events in November**

This November, local libraries are hosting Science Alive! activities, a visit by author David Riley who will talk about inspiring reluctant readers, a Christmas craft session and continuing computer training and singing lessons.

From Monday 14 to Thursday 17 November, libraries will be hosting Science Alive! who will lead a fun and interactive session on how you can help save Planet Earth. The sessions are designed to appeal to children aged 5-12. They run from 3.30 to 4.30pm, beginning at Darfield on Monday 14 November, Leeston on Tuesday 15 November, Rolleston on Wednesday 16 November, and Lincoln on Thursday 17 November. He has written a number of reading resources for teachers, parents and caregivers, and his work is frequently referenced in education, both in theory and practice. On Thursday 17 November, Lincoln Library and Service Centre will host a Christmas craft session called 'Deck the Halls,' from 6.30-9.30pm. At the session participants will make a customised tree decoration, a bunting advent calendar for kids, letterpress cards and customised gift tags, handmade wrapping paper, gift bags and presentation ideas. Included in the course fee is a generous resource pack to make the four gifts. In addition, participants will need to bring ephemera of their choice – more detail will be provided on registration. The sessions are supported with Creative Communities funding and another craft session will run on the morning of Saturday 12 November at Rolleston Christian School.
