What's an Area Plan and why do we need one?

Selwyn is growing rapidly. Last year the Council adopted *Selwyn 2031* – a district-wide strategy to help manage this growth, which identified the need for an area plan to be developed for Malvern.

The area plan will set out a 15-year framework for sustainable growth and development. It will be created by working with local communities, businesses and other key stakeholders to identify how townships in the Malvern area should grow and develop in the future.



The area plan will consider issues to do with local townships such as growth and development, the character of towns, and transport and infrastructure.

It will look at:

- · How townships in Malvern could develop over the next 15 years
- \cdot What's special about each town, and what features and characteristics should be retained as they grow
- How towns work together, and where housing, businesses, open space and community facilities could be located in the future
- · What infrastructure is needed in different areas

The area plan process won't specifically rezone any land, but it will inform the upcoming Selwyn District Plan review, future Long Term Plan processes, other Council management plans and strategies, as well as privately-initiated plan change requests.

Planning for our future

Selwyn's population has grown 33% since 2006. It's expected to increase another 40% by 2031.

How can you be involved?

We want the Malvern Area Plan to reflect what local people think is important and how they want the area to develop in the future. And we want you to be part of developing your local plan.


