# 1.0 INTRODUCTION

Porters Ski Area Limited is proposing to upgrade and expand its existing Ski Area on the Craigieburn Range in Canterbury.

In addition to the provision of new ski terrain, the project comprises an all season alpine village containing a wide range of visitor accommodation together with shops, restaurants, visitor services, hot pools and car parking.

Its form as a compact, mountain village provides a minimal footprint on the alpine landscape. The village is to be accessed from Highway 73 by a gentle gradient, sealed, all weather road and linked to the expanded Ski Area on the mountain above by gondolas.

This architectural report is focussed primarily on the alpine village component of the proposed Porters Ski Area expansion.
