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Reasons for our submission.

- 1. Spring Place is designated as a local road and designed for a low volume of traffic. It is only 5.7m wide at the southern end and will not cope with the expected increase in traffic.
- 2. When travelling west on High Street and turning right into Spring Place, there are already times when congestion becomes a problem. High Street has no turning lane or provision for passing on the left of the turning car, so turning traffic blocks the road. The expected large increase in vehicles using this intersection will add to this problem.
- 3. There are flats on the corner of the proposed road to the subdivision where mainly elderly people live. We can see a problem for them backing their cars out into what would become a busy intersection.
- 4. Presently, Spring Place is a quiet street within walking distance of the Leeston shops and amenities. There are a number of elderly people living in the street, some of whom use mobility scooters and walking aids. The current low volume of traffic means it is a safe area for these people to get around. The street is also regularly used by school students on their daily trips to and from school.
- 5. In times of high rainfall, the guttering on the side of Spring Place produces too much water for the system at the corner of Spring Place and High Street. This means water builds up in the gutter, backing up the street and causing flooding. Having another street adding to this will make the flooding worse.
- 6. We moved to Leeston and bought a house in Spring Place because of its location. The fact that it is a cul de sac making it a safe, quiet area to live. If the road is opened up to the subdivision we will lose this forever.
