Submission relates to:

Density, Road Access, Flooding, Pollution of Harts Creek

Reasons for submission:

We own property @ 184 High St Leeston which has previously been very close to flooding. We fear this subdivision will increase our likelihood of flooding.

Our farm on Leeston Southbridge Rd relies on drainage which may be compromised by this subdivision.

Harts Creek runs through our property; and we have observed the water quality of Birdlings Brook, which runs into Harts Creek, deteriorate with recent development; to the point that it actually smells bad. As custodians of this waterway; it is our job to defend its right not to be used as a dumping ground for all the heavy metals and other pollutants that will inevitably come from such developments.

We recently purchased 21A Spring Place, as its an ideal quiet, safe street for retiring parents. This proposed street access off Spring Place ensures the solitude of this street is compromised. We object to the potential disruption and inconvenience of heavy traffic during the development phase (potentially many years) and the increased residential traffic flow period.

We were declined insurance for 21A Spring Place by one company, as it was identified as a flooding zone. This development would only exacerbate the problem.

We do NOT believe there is a NEED for a development of this size in Leeston.

We would support a subdivision that allowed minimum sections similar to those of Showground Place in Leeston and prohibited access off Spring Place to heavy traffic.
