We have prepared responses to your letter of 25 June as follows;

**Density -** We have included specific reference to the minimum density for the ODP area in a Narrative attached to the ODP – refer ODP R5 attached. The Narrative also addresses urban design and the movement, green and blue networks.

Regarding the reliance on discretionary activity consents to achieve the required density, this is occurring more frequently and is now an accepted approach. I understand this approach has been used in other plan changes including PC 78 for Rolleston that was recently publicly notified. On this basis I assume that the Council find this to be an adequate approach to achieving the required density, at least at this initial stage.

**Water Race** – The blue dashed line represents a minor stormwater flow path not a water race. It was intended to be removed when the other flow paths were deleted. We have now removed this on the attached ODP Version 5
