PRIVATE PLAN CHANGE 61

R & C Wright have lodged a private plan change request with the Council.

Selwyn District Council
Clause 5 of the First Schedule, Resource Management Act 1991

Plan change 61 (PC61) proposes to change the Selwyn District Plan to rezone approximately 30 hectares located east of Darfield from Rural Outer Plains to a mix of Business 2 (17ha) and Living 1 (7ha) zone.

The change seeks to insert a development plan and associated rules into the District Plan. If approved it would result in additional industrial development and up to 35 residential sites at an average density of 1,950m2.

PC61 proposes amendments to the Selwyn District Plan that include:

- amending the District Planning Maps to rezone the subject land from Rural Outer Plains to a mix of Business 2 and Living 1.
- incorporating an outline development plan to coordinate and guide the future development of the site

The plan change request and the assessment of why it is needed can be read at Council's Rolleston Headquarters and can be viewed online at service centres and public libraries in Darfield, Leeston, Lincoln and Rolleston or at www.selwyn.govt.nz.

Any person or organisation may make a submission supporting or opposing any aspect of this plan change. Submissions must be written and in accordance with Form 5 of the Resource Management Regulations and is available from any Council Service Centre or on the website.

Further Submissions will then be invited, allowing certain persons and organisations to support or oppose any of the initial submissions. A Council hearing will then be arranged to consider all submissions, after which the Council will decide whether to reject or approve the plan change. Any submitter who is not satisfied with the Council's decision may then appeal to the Environment Court.
