Applications RC245428 / RC245429 - Southern Screenworks

Receipt of Late Submissions

- 1. I have been appointed by Selwyn District Council as Commissioner to determine applications RC245428 and RC245429, by Southern Screenworks Limited.
- 2. Submissions on the applications closed on Wednesday 15th January 2025 at 4.30pm. Two late submissions were received after the closing date as follows:
 - NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA) received on Wednesday 22nd January 2025 at 2:55pm
 - B R & J K Voice Trustees Limited, Benjamin Robert Voice, Julie Kaye Voice 137 Bealey Road received Friday 17th January at 4:50pm.
- 3. Section 37(1)(b) of the Resource Management Act 1991 provides that a consent authority may, in any particular case "waive a failure to comply with a requirement under this Act, regulations, or a plan for the time or method of service of documents."
- 4. Under Section 37A(1) a consent authority must not waive compliance with a time limit unless it has to taken into account:
 - a) the interests of any person who, in its opinion, may be directly affected by the extension or waiver; and
 - b) the interests of the community in achieving adequate assessment of the effects of a proposal, policy statement, or plan; and
 - c) its duty under section 21 to avoid unreasonable delay.
- 5. I have considered whether a waiver of time limit should be applied to the two late submissions. Both submissions raise issues of dust and amenity effects that are already raised by other submitters, although I note that the NZTA submission has a slightly different focus being dust effects on roads rather than private properties.
- 6. I consider that these are all issues that will need to be addressed at a hearing and I don't consider that the submissions raise any new matters that the applicant would not already need to address. Accordingly, I consider that accepting the submissions would be consistent with the matters to take into account under s37A, in that:
 - The interests of the applicant will not be adversely affected by the waiver of time;
 and
 - The interests of the community in achieving an adequate assessment of the effects of the proposal would be better met by accepting the submissions.
- 7. I therefore determine that the submissions be accepted.
