We are extremely disappointed with the fact that the Wheatsheaf Quarry has become a constantly expanding entity.

From the commencement of quarrying we objected to the industrialisation of Broadfield. Only on being advised of the futility of attempting to prevent the quarry being established and having been assured by Mr Calloway that it would be limited both in area and time did we reluctantly agree to withdraw our objections.

Subsequently the quarry has expanded thru several further permits and is now lapping on the boundaries of properties / residents who were led to believe that the quarrying would have been completed by now and the neighbourhood would have returned to peace and quiet. Yes, this is NIMBYism but the quarry has continued far beyond what was proposed and promised. This hearing should be giving greater consideration to the effects on the local populace and saying enough is enough.

There are many sites on the plains remote from residences from which shingle extraction can occur. It does not need to be in the middle of a semi residential area. To allow continued noise, air, land, traffic, and possible water contamination would not be acceptable to you in your neighbourhood and neither is it in ours.

With the completion of the Southern Motorway to Rolleston, the claim of local need is no longer valid.

At the very least the monitoring and mitigation standards should not be less than those employed on the quarry sites administered by Fulton Hogan and a short finite time and area imposed.

Please consider the local residents in your deliberations.
