THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY EXTRACT FROM THE RISK ASSESSMENT CARRIED OUT BY SELWYN DISTRICT COUNCIL WHEN CONSIDERING THE INTRODUCTION OF VACCINE PASSES AT COUNCIL FACILITIES, **AS AT 8 DECEMBER 2021**.

Note: the requirement for Vaccine Pass may be revised depending on level of risk. The Council will advise all staff and elected members and others visiting our facilities/reserves if changes are made.

Gatherings at Community Centres and Halls (Not Core)²

Fairs, Markets

Gatherings Delivery are defined as situations where people gather for a particular reason such as a wedding, funeral, church services, meeting.

Gatherings are commonly one off, but not always.

- Gatherings without Vaccine Pass (evidence of double immunisation) are permitted for up to 50 people in total, subject to the size of the venue (some venues are too small
- There must be provision made for 1 metre per person in the venue. Additionally, the venue must be in use for no other activities / events at the time. If the venue is being used for other events/activities Vaccine Pass (evidence of double immunisation) will be required
- Gatherings for more than 50 people in total require Vaccine Pass (evidence of double immunisation). This applies even when there are no other activities/events taking place in the venue.

Where Vaccine Pass (evidence of double immunisation) ARE required there is no limit on numbers other than fire safety occupancy limit for Facility that can attend a gathering.

Where Vaccine Pass (evidence of double immunisation) are NOT required at a gathering that is limited to up to 50 people, based on 1 metre distancing and dependent on size of the Facility.
