The committee is made up of community representatives who are familiar with the broad range of local arts activity. Assessors who are community representatives can sit on the committee for a maximum of 2 x 3-year terms.

Assessor responsibilities:

- Promote arts in the district by:
 - encouraging local groups to apply for the Creative Communities Scheme
 - attending performances and exhibitions
- Review applications prior to each meeting
- Attend meetings organised by Selwyn District Council to decide on which applicants will be awarded funding, in accordance with the Creative Communities Scheme Assessors Guide (twice-four times per year)
- Discuss and make recommendations for promoting the scheme locally
- Receive reports on funded projects and discuss completed projects
