

Content Notes:

- Where a watering point is to be replaced or is required on a subdivision from a water race beyond the boundary the water shall be delivered via a pipe to the trough to eliminate water loss. Adjacent landowners must be consulted as right of access is not guaranteed.
- The level of the top of the trough is to be higher than the level of the water race from which it is piped unless a ball cock is installed to prevent overflow.
- Where the ground is higher than the adjacent race the site must be excavated for the trough.
- The use of dead end races with soak pits is discouraged where they are entirely within one property.
- Dead-end races proportionally lose more water than other races. Water lost into soak holes is lost from the system.
- The preferred system is that the water be piped into a storage tank and from there reticulated to other parts of the farm.
- A pump can be used to further reticulate areas higher than the tank.
- The pipe is not a council owned asset and will be owned by the applicant.
