

STATEMENT OF PROPOSAL TO REVIEW A BYLAW FOR SELWYN DISTRICT COUNCIL STOCK CONTROL BYLAW 2008

(This statement is made for the purposes of sections 83 and 86 of the Local Government Act 2002)

Nature of the Proposal

This is a statement of proposal by the Selwyn District Council (The Council) to review the current "Stock Control Bylaw 2000", which was adopted by the Council on 11 October 2000. This review will result in the 2008 version becoming the new bylaw.

Throughout this report, the process will be referred to as the review of the current bylaw ("the current bylaw").

The proposal to review the bylaw is made pursuant to:

The current bylaw was originally adopted under Section 72 of the Transport Act 1962 and Section 681 of the Local Government Act 1974.

The Local Government Act 2002 section 158(2)(a) states that the current bylaw must be reviewed no later than 1 July 2008 (if the bylaw was made prior to 1 July 2003).

Reasons for this Proposal

To review, and update as necessary, the current bylaw in accordance with the requirements of the Local Government Act 2002

The proposed new bylaw is to be known as the **Selwyn District Council Stock Control Bylaw 2008** ("the proposed new bylaw").

The statutory requirements for introducing a bylaw

Appropriateness

The current bylaw exists to assist in the compliance with current legislation. Once this bylaw has expired, there is no clear mandate for ensuring ongoing compliance. Sets clear guidelines and provides information to the public.

Options Available to Council

- 1. **Do nothing** failure to review the current bylaw by 1 July 2008 will results in its lapse by 2010 and a new process would need to be implemented.
- 2. Revoke the current bylaw and rely on other methods the Council will then have no statutory authority to control stock on Selwyn district roads.

3. **Proceed with the review.** Review of the current bylaw will ensure it is up to date with relevant legislation and polices, and also update it in terms of current management and operating best practices.

This Statement of Proposal has been prepared on the basis that Council wishes to proceed with Option 3: **Proceed with the review** to formulate a proposed new bylaw.

Benefits/Costs

- That the proposed new bylaw will operate under current legislation and management practices.
- The proposed new bylaw will continue to protect the public from inadequately controlled stock on Selwyn district roads that can create a safety hazard and to minimise damage to Selwyn district roads.
- Define terms not previously made clear, and to bring further clarity to the proposed new bylaw by means of simplification where possible to make it easier to understand by the general public, and to assist Council staff in achieving compliance in a fair and straight forward manner.
- Correct minor errors, and other deficiencies and problems that have been identified during the course of application of the current bylaw that has detracted from its original intent.
- The proposed new bylaw will align with current Council policies and best practices.
- In line with the provisions of the Local Government Act 2002, the proposed new bylaw will utilise penalties for non-compliance of up to \$20,000.
- The cost of non compliance, i.e. a breach of the proposed new bylaw, will be met by those who move stock in a manner which does not comply with the requirements of the bylaw.

Provide Maori the opportunity to contribute:

The Council considers that the public notification and opportunity for submission process in February 2008 will provide adequate opportunity for public response, including Maori.

NZ Bill of Rights:

Section 155(2) ((b) of the Local Government Act 2002 requires that any new bylaw not be inconsistent with the NZ Bill of Rights Act 1990. Council have obtained legal advice to ensure that the proposed new bylaw is consistent with the NZ Bill of Rights Act 1990.

The review of the current bylaw is being processed in a democratic manner by the Council by publicly notifying its intentions, the taking and hearing of submissions and the final consideration being made by an elected Council.

^{*} It is viewed that written submissions should be reviewed and heard if requested by an appointed subcommittee of Council staff and Councillors. From this process, amendments or changes to the draft bylaw can be incorporated for the consideration of Council to adopt the bylaw at its meeting of 14 May 2008. If it is the view of the subcommittee that the draft bylaw cannot be presented at that time for adoption or if there are further considerations identified by the Council at the meeting of 14 May 2008, this shall be reported back to Council including recommendations on how to proceed at the meeting of 11 June 2008.

Submissions

Submissions are invited on the proposal to review the current "Stock Control Bylaw 2000", which was adopted by the Council on 11 October 2000. This review will result in the 2008 version becoming the new bylaw.

The proposed bylaw is to be known as the **Selwyn District Council Stock Control Bylaw 2008** ("the proposed bylaw").

At its meeting on 13 February 2008 the Council passed a resolution approving the proposed new bylaw for the purposes of public consultation through the special consultative procedure prescribed in the Local Government Act 2002.
