Initial proposal for representation arrangements for the 2022 local elections

On 25 August 2021 Selwyn District Council reviewed its representation arrangements, and resolved that the following proposal apply for the Council and its community board for the elections to be held on 8 October 2022:

Council representation

The Council is proposing that the Council comprise 10 members elected from four wards, and the mayor. The four wards reflect the following identified communities of interest:

Ward	Communities of interest
Ellesmere Ward	Brookside, Burham, Burham Military Camp, Doyleston, Dunsandel, Greenpark, Irwell, Killinchy, Lakeside, Leeston, Mead, Motukarara, Rakaia Huts, Sedgemere, Southbridge, Taumutu
Malvern Ward	Arthurs Pass, Castle Hill, Coalgate, Darfield, Glenroy, Glentunnel, Halkett, Hororata, Kirwee, Lake Coleridge, Sheffield, Springfield, West Melton, Waddington, Whitecliffs, Windwhistle
Rolleston Ward	Rolleston
Springs Ward	Ladbrooks, Lincoln, Prebbleton, Springston, Tai Tapu, Weedons

The population that each member will represent is as follows:



In accordance with section 19V(2) of the Local Electoral Act 2001 the population that each member represents falls within the range of 6,968 +/- 10% (6,271 to 7,665).

The proposed boundaries of the four wards are as shown in Map 1 below:

Community board representation

The Council proposes that a community board be elected representing the Malvern Ward.

The Malvern Community Board will elect five members, and will be subdivided into three subdivisions for electoral purposes as follows:

Subdivision	Area of Subdivision
Hawkins	Darfield, Kirwee, Sheffield, Waddington
Tawera	Arthurs Pass, Castle Hill, Coalgate, Glenroy, Glentunnell, Hororata, Lake Coleridge, Springfield, Whitecliffs, Windwhistle
West Melton	Halkett, West Melton

The population that the members of each subdivision will represent is shown below:



The population each member of the Malvern Community Board represents falls within the range of 2,980 +/-10% (2,682 – 3,278) in accordance with section 19V(2) of the Local Electoral Act 2001.

The proposed boundaries of the three electoral subdivisions are as shown in Map 2 below:
