ReDiscover a better environment

This month we opened our 'not brand new' ReDiscover waste education facility at the Pines Resource Recovery Park near Rolleston. This amazing new centre offers free waste minimisation and sustainability programmes for schools and community groups across the district. To set an example, from the get-go the buildings are old, relocated classroom blocks and the car park is made from recycled asphalt and plastic oil containers and waste engine oil. The centre has already had hundreds of children through its doors, learning about practical ways to rethink how to manage waste.

To be added in the near future is a community garden hub and an awesome reuse shop. Eventually there will also be maker spaces, kitted out with tools to repair, refurbish, repurpose or upcycle items that would have otherwise been thrown away. Selwyn's rural treasures

There are many hidden gems across our district. Some of these are nestled into the corners of our rural communities and others right under our noses. All these rural industries produce a range of delicious, and often surprising, food and drink. Aroha drinks is the labour of love created by Mark Dillon. Based in Springston, Mark's one-man band curates completely natural soft drinks and cordials after he was inspired by his mother's homemade elderflower drinks recipe. On the outskirts of West Melton, Jo and Andrew Horsbrugh's walnut orchard have offerings from simple nuts to walnut flour and oil. On the old Westcoast Road, Boechii Park grow Italian bianchetto white truffles and if these aren't exotic enough for you, take a trip to Wairiri Buffalo close to Glenroy for a taste of buffalo yoghurt, halloumi, mozzarella and ricotta. They will even offer you a farm tour if you choose to stay over. If it's a tipple you're after there's a choice from the award-winning Sauvignon Blanc at the Rosendale vineyard, a Riesling at Straight 8 in Burnham, or the ever-popular Summer Love Sparkling at Melton Estate. Any one of these will welcome you for a tasting. There's so much on offer, jump on our Selwyn.nz website to see what else is out there.

Striking a CORDE

CORDE is the construction, maintenance and water team owned by your Council, and they're celebrating their one-year anniversary of uniting and rebranding as CORDE.

Over the past year, they have gone from strength to strength as Selwyn's trusted force. CORDE take care of many key services that keep our community ticking. They maintain the delivery of our drinking water, manage wastewater through state-of-the-art facilities, keep our parks and reserves in tip-top shape and look after the ever-developing Pines Resource Recovery Park.

Alongside the great work they do in our backyard, they're also busy across the South Island, managing the road maintenance for Waimakariri and Hurunui districts, and the parks and reserves for Timaru District including the award-winning gardens at Caroline Bay. Other high-profile CORDE projects range from building subdivisions like Te Whāriki in Lincoln, to paving works at Te Pae Christchurch Convention Centre, and developing the lakefront of one of Aotearoa's top tourist spots, Lake Wānaka.

And it's not just us who think they are awesome; last year they were given Supreme Winner status as Civil Contractors New Zealand's Canterbury Contractor of the Year, took out the Environmental Award for the second year in a row and the national award for Construction Excellence.
