Selwyn Sister Cities Chairperson's Annual Report 2024-2025

Thank you to all members of this Committee for the many ways you all support the activities of this Selwyn Sister City Committee. The many voluntary hours given is essential to ongoing Selwyn Sister City relations.

First, I would like us to reminder Bill Woods a long-time member of this committee who was instrumental in establishing the relationships in Akitakata, Yebetsu and Coventry. His work as President of NZ Sister Cities meant that he was able to develop many international contacts.

This year the long-standing review process and the lack of understanding of the value to Selwyn and its residents has been upsetting and challenging. Your voluntary hours and money spent, providing transport, activities and travel as well as secretarial work are not understood by some. Nor is the importance of people-to-people relationships. Sister City relationships are more than economic. There seems to be a misunderstanding by some Council staff that Shandan, as part of Gansu Province is small. Gansu has a population of 25 million and we are aligned with Gansu Foreign Affairs.

As Chairperson I see no reason why the work of this committee can not continue using the present model. There does not need to be one size fits all under Local Body regulations. There can be opportunities to expand the number of Sister Cities into new areas. Other districts who have successful Sister City relationships have staff with international portfolios, who support their Sister Cities and local volunteers.

This is Bob Mugford's final term as our Council appointed member. Thank you, Bob for the many ways you have worked to enhance these relationships both internationally and within the Council and community.

China has again been our most frequently observed relationship. In September Councillor Lydia Gliddon spent 20 days in Gansu Province as the Gansu Fellow. Gansu Fellow. Unusually we had two Gansu Fellows in this financial year as the 2005 Fellowship was offered in June, instead of the normal September date. Dr Lily Chin, as a plant research scientist has been able to make some useful connections as an outcome of her 20 days in Gansu Province.

Liu Lin, our Shandan Fellow, was able to visit Lincoln University and make contact with Dr Chin. She is an agriculture teacher at Shandan Bailie Vocational College and is experimenting with growing potatoes hydroponically. Thank you to Committee members who took Liu Lin on outings.

Madam He Ying, the Chinese Consul General works tirelessly to promote relationships. This included an invitations to celebrations to mark Chinese National Day and Chinese New Year.

We were able to recruit a teacher for Lanzhou City University.

Shandan's request to bring a group of young agriculture workers did not happen as many of the names suggested did not meet the criteria.

In December, the Selwyn Committee hosted a Gansu delegation to the Rewi Alley Memorial, to Councillor Lydia Gliddon's farm and for dinner at The Café on the Green. This involvement was at the request of the Christchurch China Committee and the Christchurch City Council International department.

I was able to attend, at my own expense, a conference of Friendly Cities in Kunming in south eastern China in November 2024. Our Deputy Chairperson, Judith Pascoe also attended as a member of the Christchurch China Committee delegation. The emphasis on green environments in cities was significant including in some cities having green spaces no further than a five minute walk from residences.

Sister City member, and retired teacher Nick Kronjin, spent a month in Toraja based at Barana Christian Secondary School working to enhance the English environment or teachers and students. Thank you Nick for again giving your time and expertise so generously.

The connections with the Malvern Community Board have been strengthened mainly due to the work of Community Biard member, Calvin Payne. The 25th anniversary celebrations, in Yubtesu, in June, were attended by five Selwyn residents including two former Community Board members. The programme included visits to local scallop processing and dairy businesses, a school visit, viewing the ultra-marathon, tree planting and a formal dinner. Although Yubetsu's population is small the value they place on their international relationships is high.

I was able to make a short visit to Akitakata in June and Paul and I meet the new Mayor and Takamiya Junior High School Principal. Despite their shrinking rural population the Council maintaimns three staff devoted to international relationships including an English and a Portuguese speaker. There was strong evidence of small solar power farms through the rural area.

We continue to communicate with Coventry officials for important milestones.

The ongoing relationships with Christchurch China Committee, Hurunui District Council, Rewi Alley Foundation of NZ and NZ China Friendship Society are positive. On 29thNovember 2025 The Rewi Alley Alley Foundation of NZ will launch the Rewi Alley Trial as part of the Childrens' University sponsored by Canterbury and Lincoln University. The new Rewi Alley Musuem in Christchurch is expected to open on 20th November. It is a joint venture between Christchurch China Committee, NZ China Friendship Society and the Chinese Consulate.

Local Media including Malvern News, Selwyn Times and Ellesmere Echo have published numerous articles on the activities of this committee. Global Cities NZ newsletter also accept articles for publication.

Culture Fest each September gives a wider audience an insight into Sister City relationships.

We are indebted to Therese Davel for her work for this committee when her workload allows this.

It is my considered view that Selwyn Council and residents receive significant value from the established Sister City Relationships. The cost to the Council is minimal as most of the work is undertaken by volunteers. It is essential for the mana of international relationships that the MOU's and agreements remain with the Council. We look forward to a positive way forward with Council staff and Councillors.
