We are in communication with CPNZ to help with the set up and running of this organisation. We have drivers/patrollers ready to start training, but we need to raise funds to purchase a vehicle. We are just starting out and this is our first grant request.

Funds towards a vehicle will mean we can patrol Rolleston every night. We will have a visual presence in residential areas (where there are regular break-ins), community areas where kids often feel unsafe and where graffiti/trouble often occurs, in the new build areas where tradies are being ripped off, and in commercial areas as well. Hopefully this regular presence acts as a deterrent for opportunist trouble makers coming into Rolleston, as well as helping reduce the petty crime, and making our people feel safer when they are out and about.

The estimated cost of purchasing a new vehicle for the fleet is \$29,800.

A grant of \$29,700 is sought.

There is no standard grant for community events.

Staff support a grant being made as it will assist in keeping the community safer.

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide information to assist with the decision to recommend a grant.

2. SIGNIFICANCE ASSESSMENT/COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

No significance issues identified.

3. HISTORY/BACKGROUND

Funding will be used towards the construction of the building for the Rolleston Toy Library which will be located next to the Men's Shed by Foster Park. We are currently operating out of 2 shipping containers in an industrial area on council land and are at capacity. The conditions are quite rough during wet and windy conditions as we have no shelter for our members picking up/dropping off toys. Our aim is to create a child friendly environment where children can come play and select toys themselves.

Play is important to all children. Toys are a major factor in helping children to learn and develop their physical, mental, perceptual, and social skills through play. However, good toys are often expensive and not affordable for many families. A toy library enables its members to borrow a wide range of well-designed and educational toys at minimal cost enabling them to support their child's learning requirements. Borrowing rather than buying toys also helps to reduce the number of outgrown and broken toys in the landfills. This building will enable us to provide this service to more families in the community in a purpose-built facility that is safe and welcoming and engaging for children. The location we are currently operating out of is at capacity and is not suitable for young children, which does not align with our purpose or service.

The estimated cost of the construction of the building is \$159,397.

Funding has been done to reduce the cost by \$50,534.

A grant of \$5,000 is sought.

4. PROPOSAL

There is no standard grant for community events.

Staff support a grant being made as it will give the ability for children to use the toy library.

A grant of \$5,000 from the Selwyn Central Ward Discretionary Fund is therefore recommended.

Note that the Rolleston Toy Library have been given a grant from the Selwyn District Council Community Grant.
