I request a comprehensive, exhaustive, and complete list of all roads within the jurisdiction of your agency, as a Road Controlling Authority (RCA)	This information already exists in the public domain on the national speed register. For each such road (or part thereof), there is a sign-posted speed limit in effect as of 2 June 2025, where the sign: Complies with all requirements specified in section 8 of the Land Transport Rule: Setting of Speed Limits 2024; and Displays a speed limit that is lower than the legal or default speed limit for the same section of road, as recorded in the National Speed Limit Register (NSLR) as of 2 June 2025.
