In the last LTP consultation it was stated that STAFF supported the submission by CDHB.

This included "While the CDHB supports option 2 to chlorinate all supplies, we accept that this could be introduced in a phased approach with a risk assessment tool used to prioritise the inclusion of supplies over time"

This appears to be the current approach and it is definitely not what the residents of Selwyn want or agree to.

There is no predetermined level of risk set at which permanent chlorination would be acceptable

- --- THe BECA risk assessment tool is non scientific and does not reflect the true risks to the health of the public.
- --- Regardless of the performance of all schemes there will always be one at the bottom of the list and thus next in line for permanent chlorination by
- by staff who have declared their intention to eventually chlorinate ALL of our water based on the RISK MATRIX priority.

--- eg The EXTENSIVE SUPPLY NETWORK.

Over the years our scheme has been extended firstly to include Waireka and later to extend almost to Darfield covering the Greendale

extension.

---- "Serving a significant population".

Once again the increase in population served has been done by Council Staff

The question must be asked whether this was a deliberate action to achieve the end goal of eventually permanently chlorinating ALL of our water.

STAFF have stated that this is their goal by supporting the CDHB submission.

Are STAFF actually working to implement the wishes of the ratepayers of Selwyn or do they have an agenda of their own..

There was a lot of misinformation given to Councillors in persuading Council to allow Staff to permanently chlorinate Hartleys road scheme.

Murray Washington has stated:

- 1) The Hartleys road scheme has a HIGH LEVEL OF RISK.
- 2) Has an extensive supply network.
- 3)Serving a significant population.

4) Has been subject to a number of Ecoli issues (most recently in March this year)

As stated earlier most of the highest scoring risk factors on the BECA risk matrix are directly under the control of SDC STAFF.

The highest scoring risk for Hartleys road scheme is the depth of our well 8 points

Note there has not been a single Ecoli recorded from the treatment plant on our scheme for over 8

years

STAFF have refused requests to deepen our well saying that It is one of the best performing. The supply network and population served are directly under the control of Council staff as mentioned

earlier

Ecoli issues.

The only E coli issues faced by this scheme in more than three years prior to the permanent chlorination in 2018 were at the Glentunnel school.

There were 4 different days on which Ecoli were detected at this sample point and nowhere else in the entire network were any Ecoli found.

The faults recorded were

10 Feb 2018 1 Ecoli 14Feb 1 Ecoli 26 Feb 4 Ecoli 5 March 1 Ecoli

Of the four recordings all but one had disappeared by the time a sample was taken the following day. The only sample that had not disappeared by the following day was 1 Ecoli taken on 10 Feb 2018.

This indicates to me that perhaps the problem was related to the sampling procedures and not the contamination of the delivery system.

There were no Ecoli found anywhere else in the scheme for over three years.

The transgressions were minor and allowable under the conditions specified in the Drinking Water Standards permitted exceedances.

The tap from which the Ecoli contaminated samples came was on the footpath outside the the Glentunnel school.

The tap had no protective cabinet and was open to interference from people cats dogs birds etc.

The recommendations are that all Water Safety Plans include covered lockable cabinets over all sample points.

This is also under the control of SDC STAFF.

I personally believe that had the Staff done their job properly and had a locked cabinet protecting the sample tap then there would not have been a single Ecoli detected in the Hartleys road scheme in over three years prior to the decision to permanently chlorinate the scheme because of

HIGH RISK.

1) REZONING OF MALVERN HILLS.

We object to the rezoning of the Malvern Hills for the following reasons.

A) We purchased our land on the understanding that we could legally subdivide blocks for living on at 20ha or more.

The new DECREASE in housing density allowed has effectively decreased the value of our farm.

B) The Council's reasoning behind the change from 20Ha to 40Ha per subdivision does not make sense. ie. "Primary production underpins the Selwyn economy. We want to ensure that the rules associated with the General Rural Zone continue to support primary production."

Your proposed rule change actually has the opposite effect on protecting primary production in Selwyn. By changing the zor:e rules to force more houses to be built on flat productive land around Rolleston and Darfield and less in the less productive land of the Malvern Hills actually defeats your purpose.

More primary production is lost for each house built in Rolleston than in Malvern Hills.

There has been no Community consultation over the zone change for the Malvern Hills that I know of.

D) This appears to be just another change which penalises the rural community in favour of the development of Rolleston.

Since moving to the Malvern Hills in 1993 there have been many Council decisions made that have cost us money.

- The Notice of requirement over our land by CPW for many years. This cost us over \$100,000.

- The attempted requirement for us to create an easement in favour of SDC for the Malvern Hills Rural Water Scheme which runs through our property.

This condition was challenged and defeated.

- The charging of Chlorination rates on all stockwater on a per unit basis after clearly stating that the cost of chlorination would be on a per ratepayer basis.

- The loss of our good water through permanent chlorination. Permanent chlorination of the Hartleys road scheme was totally unnecessary as it had met the DWS for over 3 years before chlorination.

- Decision to discontinue any further sealing of rural roads.

BECAUSE IT MATTERS your statement for housing density in the Malvern Hills is confusing. In your document Quote "Increase the minimum density from one dwelling per 20 ha to one dwelling per 40ha." Is not a change from 1 per 20 ha to 1 per 40ha a decrease in density not an increase?

WATER RATE CHARGES FOR CHLORINATION

In the last consultation document Council stated that the cost of adopting option 1 would be \$10 PER RATEPAYER. Note -Council adopted Option 1 against the wishes of over 85% of submitters.

The water treatment plant was upgraded with 1 micron (0.001mm) filtration (installed mid 2017) followed by a new UV treatment system (installed 2015-16). This upgrade has been successful with no transgressions (contamination) at the treatment plant being detected.

The subsequent stage to this upgrade was the addition of permanent chlorination. Chlorination was a critical part of the upgrade and provides a residual disinfectant in the distribution system, to minimise the impact of any regrowth or contamination that could potentially enter the distribution system post treatment. Chlorination of this supply commenced 4 October 2018.

The risk assessment was developed by BECA with input from SDC, Sicon (the WTP operators), Food and Health and the Drinking Water Assessor over a number of phases.

About Sport Canterbury

Sport Canterbury is one of 17 Regional Sports Trusts operating throughout New Zealand.

We are an independent, Charitable Trust governed by a Board. We have been operating for 27 years with a presence in Christchurch, Ashburton, Timaru and Greymouth.

Our vision is 'Kia Nui Ake, Kia Kaha Ake, Te Tokomaha Ake (More People, More Active, More Often) and everything we do is about getting and keeping people engaged in sport, physical activity and play. We connect community leadership to make healthy choices more accessible to families /whānau where they live, learn, work and play, so, our communities thrive.

We achieve our outcomes through partnerships, initiatives and programmes that align to the strategic priorities set out within our strategic plan.

The Value of Sport and Recreation

Sport NZ undertook a <u>study</u> that explored the value of sport and recreation to New Zealanders, their communities and our country. *The Value of Sport* is based on extensive research, including a survey of around 2,000 New Zealanders and a review of previous studies from here and around the world.

People consulted saw real value in participating in sport and recreation. Findings included:

- 92% believe being active keeps them physically fit and healthy and helps relieve stress.
- 88% believe that sport and other physical activities provide them with opportunities to achieve and help build confidence.
- 84% believe sport brings people together and create a sense of belonging.
- 74% say sport help builds vibrant and stimulating communities.

The research also showed the ability of sport and recreation to create connected young adults and improve the health and wellbeing of New Zealanders.

Wellbeing is more important than ever with the COVID-19 pandemic and the highly uncertain economic outlook both having an impact on all aspects of our wellbeing.

The impact of COVID-19 on the play, active recreation and sport sector

COVID-19 has placed significant pressure on Aotearoa New Zealand's play, active recreation and sport system.



Organisations which play a key role in supporting New Zealanders to be active were impacted by COVID-19 including lost revenue, cash flow difficulties, reduced capacity to deliver and changes in membership. All these things have hit the sector hard and will have an ongoing impact in a continued uncertain future.

The importance of councils to the sector

Sport Canterbury covers an area that includes 10 Territorial Local Authority areas. Councils are an important partner for Sport Canterbury.

We see councils playing a key role in our goal to ensuring everyone has access to quality physical activity options.

Councils have a key role in facility planning, development and operation that enables play, active recreation and sport but are increasingly involved in running or supporting local programmes which drive physical activity and wellbeing as well.

Sport Canterbury will always aim to maintain its independence while working with councils to achieve the best outcome for the sport, active recreation and play sector.

A regional approach to facility planning and delivery.

Since 2017, Sport Canterbury has led the development of three Spaces and Places Plans covering the Greater Christchurch, South Canterbury and West Coast areas. These plans aimed to provide a cross-boundary approach to facility planning and prioritisation to ensure needs were met on a regional basis avoiding duplication.

Sport Canterbury is now reviewing these plans and bringing them all together into one overall plan for the whole of the Sport Canterbury Region. We see these plans as being beneficial to councils when considering investment in sport, active recreation and play facilities.

These plans are available on our <u>website</u> and have been integral in forming the basis of this submission.

However, the comments presented within this submission are those of Sport Canterbury only and do not necessarily represent any individual or other sporting, or other group.

Submission Points

General

Thank you for maintaining your investment in sport and recreation across many areas during some extremely tough economic times. The benefits are real, human and long lasting for the people of Selwyn, particularly when you consider only 22% of adults across the region are meeting the Ministry of Health physical activity guidelines.

Strategic Approach

Sport Canterbury applauds Council for the strategic approach taken regarding sport and recreation across the district with the development and implementation of the following strategies and plans:

- Selwyn Physical Activity Strategy
- Aquatic Facilities Strategy
- Community Centres and Halls Strategic Plan
- Selwyn Walking and Cycling Strategy
- Community Facilities Activity Management Plan

We look forward to working with you to support the implementation of these strategic approaches.

Sport Canterbury also supports the network approach planned for the management of facilities and spaces and the introduction of more consistent levels of service and maintenance standards for recreation reserves across the district.

Facilities

Sport Canterbury applauds Council for the work undertaken over the period of the last LTP, with a number of those projects, like the Selwyn Aquatic Centre extension, Selwyn Sports Centre and Te Ara Ātea and Rolleston Town Centre, either recently completed, or shortly due for completion.

We commend Council for the ongoing investment in the maintenance and development of recreation facilities to ensure they are fit for purpose, meeting the needs of an increasing population and changing participation trends.

Sport Canterbury supports Council's decision to review indoor recreation provision, including aquatics provision in the Malvern area, later in the LTP period to take account of forecast population increases and the impact of the Selwyn Aquatics Centre extension and the new aquatics facility being built in Hornby. We encourage Council to consider any hubbing opportunities available when considering any future facility development.

We support the prioritisation of the upgrade of the swimming pool in Darfield, to extend the life of the pool and improve the swim experience for users.

Sports Parks



Sport Canterbury supports Council's ongoing investment into sports fields and advocates that Council continues to maintain the quality of these fields to at least the same level that they are at now.

Sport Canterbury supports the prioritisation of installation of a lit artificial hockey turf at Foster Park to meet the increasing needs of hockey to play and train locally and to free up space on the multi-use pitch for other sports.

We advocate for the provision of a dedicated crocket green at Broadfield Reserve to meet growing demand and for development of additional artificial cricket pitches to relive pressure on existing grounds, particularly in the Rolleston and West Melton areas.

Sport Canterbury supports the proposed extension at the Lincoln Sports Park and the District Park development on the eastern side of Rolleston.

Active Recreation

Increasing numbers of New Zealanders are choosing active recreation, often 'pay for play' over traditional sport as it allows them greater flexibility to fit activity around their work and family commitments without fixed time commitments that often go with traditional sport training, particularly team sports, and competition.

Sport Canterbury supports Council's commitment to investment in and prioritisation of a number of initiatives that support active recreation, such as:

- The development of additional space and facilities for outdoors sports and recreation at:
 - o Prebbleton
 - o Rolleston
 - Leeston
 - o Lincoln
 - Kirwee
 - West Melton
 - Southbridge
- The acquisition and development of neighbourhood and passive reserves in townships as they grow
- New cycleways that will promote both active transport and recreation:
 - o Glentunnel to Whitecliffs
 - o Templeton to Prebbleton
 - o Rolleston to Burnham
 - Jones Road
- District wide footpath upgrades that will promote both active transport and recreation
- Rhodes Park Walkway construction
- Youth Park development at Foster Park
- Development of the Birches Road Park in Prebbleton
- Redevelopment of 4 hectares of the Rolleston Reserve as a high amenity park
- Consideration of potential active recreation users in the development of a new:
 - Community Centre at Leeston Park
 - Hororata Community Centre at the Domain
 - o Prebbleton Community Centre



Play

Play is key to a child's development, supporting development of spatial awareness, considered risk taking, self-confidence and social skills. Placement of safe and attractive play spaces can also promote a sense of vibrancy and community in a neighbourhood. Accordingly, **Sport Canterbury supports Council's commitment to investment in both maintenance and development of play spaces and applauds the performance measure regarding the number of playgrounds per 1000 children as being higher than the national median, as this ensures equity of access.**

Summary

Staff Comments

This submission requests a specific fund for heritage and history activity with a particular interest in heritage trail development, recording digitally memories of older residents, telling stories about important parts of the district etc. . Current Te Ara planning involves working with heritage network to ensure that each group has an opportunity for a piece to be loaned and put in to a temporary themed display when Te Ara Atea opens. Te Ara Atea will attempt to regularly display loaned items from local heritage groups, but will not have storage facilities for retaining items permanently.

Council (via ACLL team) does undertake a range of programmes with local heritage / history groups that Council funds directly e.g. Selwyn Tours App (for providing online access to commentated heritage trails, local historic sites and artefacts, the history of particular townships etc) and for the digital archiving of a range of historic stories of Selwyn via Selwyn Stories. Council is currently engaged in discussions with Canterbury Museum re increasing travelling exhibitions, loans and educational programmes across the Selwyn network of key facilities (primarily Te Ara Atea and libraries). Council is involved with similar discussion with Lincoln University. Council also has plans and a modest budget to introduce a community scanning programme in the next twelve months that allows community groups to loan a scanner and generate their own digital files for preservation. At time of previous Long Term Plan, Council made a decision to place a three year limit on the term of funding that Council, collectively decided to allocate to specific providers on the basis that the providers were considered as "Strategic Partners". This funding term concludes on 30 June, 2021. While the total amount of funding remains, a Report will be prepared for Council that summarises performance of Strategic Partners over previous three years (based on provider feedback/ reports) and identifies potential new strategic partners that have been identified through long term planning process.







We respectfully request the Selwyn District Council accepts this late submission from the New Zealand Motor Caravan Association Inc. (NZMCA).

The NZMCA currently represents 105,000 New Zealanders, many of whom enjoy exploring our country (including Selwyn) at leisure in their certified self-contained motorhomes and caravans. Approximately 13,800 individual members live in and around Selwyn and enjoy camping in their own backyard.

Our members have identified the need for a new public dump station in Rolleston and the NZMCA would like to help the Council install this facility for the general public. It is essential that Council continues to provide well-functioning public dump stations in and around Selwyn. The Local Government Act 2002 and section 23 of the Health Act 1956 require local authorities to improve, promote, and protect public health. Local authorities must assess the need for sanitary services to protect public health from indiscriminate waste disposal. Most local authorities, during their assessments under Part 7 of the Local Government Act, determine the need to provide for public toilets, which serve both residents and visitors alike.

Local Government New Zealand s guidance on assessing sanitary services notes:

For some territorial authorities, the need for and supply of effluent disposal facilities (i.e. facilities for the disposal of wastewater and sewage from trucks and campervans etc.) may be relevant in the assessment of public toilets (Ref: Local Government New Zealand (2000). The knowhow guide to assessing water and sanitary services under the Local Government Act 2002, p. 29.)

The main benefits of a well-functioning public dump station include:

- Providing a safe and convenient facility for local ratepayers to use when they return home from their motorhome and caravan holidays.
- Support the local visitor industry which benefits financially from domestic and international motorhome tourism.

Helping to protect communities and the environment by providing facilities that encourage visitors and ratepayers to safely dispose of their wastewater.

The NZMCA has supported the installation of other dump stations across the district.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT, in partnership with the New Zealand Motor Caravan Association Inc., the Council establishes a budget in the Long Term Plan 2021-31 to prioritise the installation of a new public dump station in Rolleston.

The NZMCA would provide the pre-cast unit, signage and a substantial financial contribution towards this new facility. The value of the NZMCA s financial contribution would be subject to further information on the location, design, and estimated development costs.

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Dear Selwyn District Council My apologies for the lateness of this submission made on behalf of the Waihora Ellesmere Trust. I am afraid I confused the deadline for the Proposed District Plan further submissions with that for the LTP.

I trust you will find space to consider this submission and provide an opportunity for me to speak to it on behalf of the Trust.

The Waihora Ellesmere Trust submission is below and look forward to the opportunity of speaking to the submission at a hearing.

The Trust is a Charitable Trust with the health of Te Waihora/Lake Ellesmere its environs and tributaries at the core of its purpose for existing. Its interests lie primarily within Selwyn District, but the international connectedness of the species that are part of the Lake ecosystem means we have interests in issues beyond the immediate district and region.

The Trust's membership is open to anyone and the Trustees are all elected by the membership.

It operates an open webpage. http://www.wet.org.nz/ Through this it supports science, effective management, networks and community education and facilitates action. The Trust has in the past employed a part time manager to assist in the development and implementation of the Trusts activities and this has bene supported in part by grant funds from the Council.

The Trust has almost two decades of experience as a community organisation partnering with and very appreciative of the support and good relationship with the Selwyn District Council. We have worked together on many projects and the Trust has been able to add value to the work of the Council through its networks, accessing additional funding sources and access to knowledge and volunteers.

The Trust is pleased to see the ongoing commitment in the LTP to deliver on factors that contribute to the improved health of Te Waihora/Lake Ellesmere, especially through the attention to and funding for biodiversity management and water, but also in the commitment to recreation.

Over the last financial year, since the departure of our former manager to join SDC, the Trust has been reviewing the current state of play in actions in the catchment.

The considerable demographic changes occurring in the catchment coupled with the move to increase the recreational and in-country tourism options that covid has forced, has led us to focus on making Lake Ellesmere Te Waihora more accessible. This is primarily to engage new settlers in the catchment with the Lake and its internationally significant values, promote understanding and action.

We also anticipate better access to the lake will serve a wider NZ community through additional things to do while vacationing in the region, perhaps encouraging them to spend and extra day here and add to their local expenditure.

Our particular interest, however, is in engaging people living in the Catchment with the Lake. Research by Lincoln University (at the Trust's request) has shown that people appreciate the Lake's values more when they have visited it than if they have not, and we consider they are more likely to engage with it positively if there are attractions. Making people aware that they live in the catchment of such an amazing body of water and that their actions contribute to its wellbeing is a key driver of our plans.

Over a decade ago the Trust published a brochure with a map providing information on access to the Lake and associated information. We now see an opportunity to increase the accessibility to the Lake and provide additional options to encourage recreation, tourism and general engagement with the Lake in a way that promotes healthy recreation and will enhance the health of the Lake.

We intend to establish additional cycle/walkways to facilitate access to and along the Lake with the ultimate goal of enabling a circum-lake route. We therefore seek that funds be set aside in the LTP and the annual plan to assist that to occur and to support us to manage that process.

These additional walkways/cycleways would include associated biodiversity improvements and educational opportunities, and potential to promote the dual heritage of the community (tangata whenua and tangata tiriti) with the Lake. This would enable community members opportunities for active engagement and motivation to engage in restoration activities and recreation and learning in places currently inaccessible in a practical sense.

The Trust looks forward to continuing to work with the Council over the coming years on a number of ongoing projects, notably with the biennial Living Lake Symposium the first of which was held in 2007. The next one is scheduled for November 2021 and we request that the Council budget make adequate provision for supporting the Symposium as it has in the past, both in kind and in cash.

In the past the Trust has employed a manager to assist in obtaining and administering funds and operationalising projects. This has enabled the Trust to bring significant funds from outside the region to assist with projects like environmental restoration. The ability of voluntary community organisations to achieve these outcomes is largely due to grant funds that are not tied to specific projects. We have very much appreciate the annual grant funds provided by Council to assist us in this respect and seek that grant funds be included in the LTP to enable us to continue to carry out such activities as the walk/cycleway project, community education, and symposium. We are pleased to see consideration of a solution to the issue of the Selwyn Huts sewage. The Selwyn Huts have long been a key recreational place in the community and hut members voluntarily contribute to maintaining a walkway between the upper and lower huts that is well-used. The huts themselves are of significant heritage value. Providing a long term solution to the sewage would benefit the Lake and the Selwyn/Waikirikiri.

We also remain committed to participating with the Lake opening protocol and other initiatives to build the cooperation and collaborate with groups and agencies working for similar or related goals to those of the Trust within the catchment.

As the Trust does not own land and does not pay rates it is inappropriate for it to comment on such areas or express a preference for any of the options presented in the LTP discussion document, or otherwise comment on matters outside the ambit of the Trusts Objects. Question:

To whom it may concern,

I have been working in the field of youth work for over ten years, and during this time I have noticed a need for young people to have safe, inclusive 'hang-out' spaces. I have been working in Rolleston for 1.5 years and during this time I have noticed a gap in services and spaces for our young people. In particular, there are no structured social spaces for young high school aged people to safely build social connection, technically known as social capital.

Social capital is the natural bonds built between people who live and work close to each other – it is the bonds of connection that naturally occur when engaging in safe, supportive environments where commonality brings people together. These bonds forged in such interactions were there are common interests means people naturally rely on and support once another, ultimately meaning less reliance on agencies and professional services.

To this end, I want to propose a drop-in space in the current community centre for high school aged young people. Currently, the skate park is the common area where many young people converge. As there no adult supervision, activities that are antisocial are beginning to occur here, including tagging, smoking, swearing, bullying and other negative behaviour. In an area close to the playground, park, shopping centre it has an undesirable effect. It also discourages other younger children coming to hang out in this space, as it is likely the atmosphere would be quite intimidating for young children, as well as their parents.

My proposal to use the library and general community hall space means that young people are better contained and channelled in the direction of more pro-social activities. Weeknights after school are the most common times when young people have time on their hands, especially as parents may be working late. The space would provide a positive, activity-based hub where young people can complete homework, play pool, table tennis, arcade games, watch movies, listen to music and generally chill out in a warm, inviting space where there is adult presence.

In time, I would like to work with other community members and organisations to collaborate and extend the use of the space. This may involve opening up the area for other activities such as family group conferences, supervised visits with OT, volunteers coming to support young people with learning needs, extra-curricular classes/activities.

Overall, I believe the rapid development of Rolleston is leading to an increase in young high school aged people who need access to spaces that build social capital. Currently there is a gap for anything like a drop-in centre or hub. In order to ensure Rolleston develops a positive and prosocial youth culture, hubs where community development can occur will increase the wellbeing and opportunity for these young residents of Rolleston.
