

This option means additional funding and upgrades, with the specific purpose of avoiding chlorination, would need to be added within the 2021-31 LTP as additional projects. The additional cost of this option is estimated to be \$30M capex and an additional \$0.2M operational expense. The increase in the water rate would be around \$100 per year per property. It is proposed that an exemption from chlorination from Taumata Arowai would be required prior to spending additional money on our water supplies.

The Selwyn District Plan is currently under review and has been out for public consultation. This process involved identification and assessment of historic buildings, which included a public nominations.

The Council also has a Historic Heritage Fund that can be applied to for funding on an annual basis to help protect and maintain heritage items. The fund is generally over subscribed to. A view to provide for wider heritage funding beyond listed heritage buildings has merit but is beyond that budgeted for in the LTP.

On the point about working with Ecan to remove willows Council is seeking a review from Ecan on the regional rating areas and management of rivers, including the Selwyn, to provide funding for river management beyond existing regional rating areas.

Staff Comments Submitter supports district-wide fund to support significant heritage and district history. Council funding for community projects Selwyn Community Grants Fund (SCGF) is available and used for activities associated with heritage activities although not exclusively. Creative Communities is a national arts and culture fund that Council administers that does fund some heritage / historic projects but not exclusively. There is also a Selwyn Heritage Fund (heritagefund@selwyn.govt.nz) available to assist property and reserve owners with work required to maintain and enhance buildings and protected trees in the district. Aside from above, there is currently no specific funding pool that is available exclusively for “heritage/ history”. Submissions received varied in regards to purpose / criteria for such a funding pool. Overall trend of submissions was away from funding for capital works and supportive of funding to support and retain volunteers and volunteers’ operational activities associated with history and heritage.

Staff Recommended Action If this submission was accepted in full or in part, then the following would be impacted:

Staff Comments Coalgate Reserve Toilets & Drinking Fountain: The current level of use for this reserve makes it difficult to support public toilet provision. It is not used for any organized sport but has some recreational facilities for casual use (tennis court, BMX track, walking track etc.) and overall use is relatively low. It is, however, one of the larger recreation spaces that does not have a public toilet available.

If Council was to support this submission it is estimated that it would cost \$160,000 to \$200,000 to provide a single cubicle toilet in this location with the cost of installing an effluent system likely to be high. This includes installation of a water supply and drinking fountain. Annual operating costs are estimated to be \$10,000 per year. A toilet with a holding tank would be less to install (\$100,000) but would have higher ongoing operating costs (\$12,500 pa). This project would need to be mainly funded by rates but a small portion of growth funding (reserve DCs) could be applied.





I feel that the Council should be taken to task that they didn't speak to the Selwyn District Council employees that currently are working in the Library and give them all the information. Instead they were left to hand out the Long Term Plan booklets and explain basically what was in there, any questions I asked were left unanswered and I had to call and speak to someone with all my questions to get answers. Also knowing that a major project was in the Long Term Plan for Leeston why did they schedule the "drop in" at the Library at the beginning where staff had barely time to advertise it, I didn't find out till weeks later, and then the Selwyn Times comes out and it has even more information in, nearly a week before submissions are expected. Why wasn't all that information in the book. Apparently a lot of rumours are going around about the proposed site, also no date listed in the booklet but given in the Selwyn Times article (2022-23). Given that the current building needs to be earthquake proofed and leaks like a sieve, asking the staff to use that building, as well as the public that daily access services there, a new building can't come soon enough.
