Big Decision 2a & 2bCommunity Spaces



You told us that planning for growth and having good access to community spaces were very important to you.

In the previous Long-Term Plan we agreed to upgrade Leeston Park and build a new community facility there that would include a library, community centre and Council service centre.

This project is called Waihora Whata Rau. Costs have increased on this project, but we know there is a need for a community space and to repair or replace the earthquake prone library building. We want to know how you would like us to go forward with this project.



Big Decision 3Malvern Recreation & Sports Facility



We are proposing to build an indoor recreation and sports facility at Darfield, which would help create a central hub for Malvern, as other existing and future facilities are developed in Darfield

We want to know if you think we should build a sports facility for Malvern that has one indoor court or two indoor courts, or whether we shouldn't build it at all.

Long-Term Plan



We want to hear from you on our Long-Term Plan

The Long-Term Plan is our plan for the next 10 years – what we're committing to do, how and when, and how it will be paid for.

This plan is about your future Selwyn. It's been put together based on feedback you've given us about your priorities. It's important that we balance growth and affordability.

We have some big decisions ahead of us and now it's time for you to have your say.

From 2 April to 2 May, we will be asking for your feedback on the plan including some big decisions around public transport and some new community spaces.



Big Decision 1Public Transport



You have told us you wanted better access to public transport via Park and Ride facilities and bus stops.

We want to hear from you about the options for building new Park and Ride facilities in Rolleston and Lincoln and improving our bus stops with new shelters and real-time bus information.

In the past we have received co-funding from New Zealand Transport Agency Waka Kotahi that covers 51% of our project costs. If we receive this funding again, we propose to use it for this work, with us paying \$4.2m in the first three years and \$11.6m over the next seven years of the Long-Term Plan period.
